

New O'Hare Runway Means Less Noise for Northlake

The commissioning of runway 10 center/28 center at O'Hare Airport will not only create a safer environment around the airport, but will also mean a reduction in noise for Northlake.

The new runway is scheduled to be commissioned on October 17, 2013 which will result in O'Hare Airport operating in an east-west configuration nearly 100% of the time. The new runway will mark the completion of the first phase of the airport

modernization plan which will reduce or eliminate the use of the existing crisscrossing runways which run diagonally across the airport, which will automatically reduce air traffic over the City of Northlake.

After being subjected to airport noise for over 50 years, we are certainly looking forward to some relief after October.

Reminder About Tents


Tents, defined as any portable structure, including sunscreens, with or without walls, made of canvas or other like materials, need to be dismantled from the front yard between Labor Day and Memorial Day. These structures need to be dismantled from areas other than the front yard between November 1 and April 1. This ordinance, O-16-2002, includes poles, stakes, wires and ropes.

Inoperable Vehicles Prohibited

Northlake Municipal code prohibits storing or parking junk cars or inoperable vehicles in residential districts. This regulation applies to any unlicensed vehicles or those with flat tires, broken windshields or other conditions that make them inoperable.


Solicitors Warning

Public Works Department Re-Uses Old Sign

The talented Public Works Department made use of the base left from the cross which was moved from the former Lutheran Church on Wolf Road by placing the ground level sign on top of it.

The base of the cross was approximately 15 feet high, but the blueprints for the building indicated it went into the ground at least 10 feet with a concrete foundation. Removal would have been extremely difficult. The ground level exterior sign was a perfect solution as



to how to put the base to use, so the Public Works Department was able to secure the sign by welding it to the top of the base. The City saved money by utilizing these existing items in this manner thanks to the Public Works Department.

The building has been named "Northlake City Centre." The Veteran's Park District will be operating a pre-school in one part of the facility, and the City is developing uses for the remainder of this latest asset to the City of Northlake.

Snow Removal

During and after snowstorms, and depending on the size and severity of the storm, a fleet of vehicles is used to clear streets and keep them safe and clear for pedestrians and other vehicles. Typically, snowplow operators remove snow from the center of the street to the curb in a series of four passes. Main roads are cleared first, followed by neighborhood streets and other less-traveled roadways.

During heavy snowfalls, especially if snow is accompanied by windy conditions, the operations can be time consuming and continues day and night until completed. Because it is inevitable that snow will be pushed onto driveway entrances, homeowners are encouraged to wait for city crews to finish their work before clearing private property approaches. Residents are asked not to

blow or shovel snow onto the street when clearing sidewalks and driveways. Parking on the street is not allowed for eight hours following a snowfall of two inches or more.

Recreation and Shopping

We provide free rides to: Target, Wal-Mart, Beauty/Barber Shops, Senior Clubs, Post Office, Banks, Grocery Stores, North Riverside Mall, (Oakbrook and Yorktown Malls are on Mondays ONLY)

Ride reservations can be made for Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m., (except holidays and when the Township offices are closed).

Due to traffic inconsistencies, clients are required to be ready 15-minutes prior to their scheduled pick-up time and to watch for the Township car. The driver will stop at the designated address and wait briefly (5-minutes), if there is no response, the driver will leave. Our drivers are not allowed to go inside a client's home.

Scheduling Procedures:

- Call (708/344-8801) for reservations. Multiple stops are not allowed.
- You must call by 12:00 noon, the previous day, to reserve your appointment.
- If you are going shopping, you are allowed no more than two (2) packages.
- The rider cannot reserve travel to one location and change it with the driver.
- Each rider can have one (1) round trip per day – two (2) times per week.
- Free car transportation is provided for Proviso Township residents who are:
 - 60 years of age and older
 - Mentally challenged, who can't operate a motorized vehicle

Due to Insurance Regulations:

- Individuals, who are not physically and/or mentally able to get from their house to the car and destination by themselves, will not be transported unless accompanied by another individual who can assist them.
- Smoking is prohibited in all Township cars.
- Passengers **MUST** wear **seatbelts, at all times**, in Township vehicles; **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Those who cannot will forfeit their free ride.



Wipers and Lights

Motorists are reminded that Illinois Vehicle Code 12-201(b) requires the use of headlights, not only from sunset to sunrise, but also any time snow, rain, ice, fog or other weather conditions require the use of windshield wipers. Headlights must also be used any time a person or vehicle on the highway is not clearly visible at a distance of 1,000 feet.

Placing Trash at Curb

Residents are reminded that trash may not be placed on the parkway before 5 p.m. the evening before the scheduled pick-up, which is Friday morning, unless there is a holiday during the week, when pick up will be on Saturday. Containers must be removed from the parkway by 5:00 p.m.

Sump Pumps

Allowing sump pump to discharge water onto city streets or sidewalks is illegal and can create icy and dangerous conditions for motorists and pedestrians during periods of cold weather.

Holiday Decorations and Gift Wrapping Disposal

Even if you've been a good recycler all year long, holiday wrappings can present a challenge. Is wrapping paper recyclable? What about Christmas tree ornaments? Tinsel? Here is the answer to the "naughty and nice" list of recyclable holiday material.

Recyclable:

- gift boxes • tissue paper
- shoe boxes • wrapping paper
- holiday cards/envelopes • gift bags (if paper)

Non-Recyclable:

- bubble wrap (consider reusing)
- foam peanuts
- ribbon and bows
- sticky gift labels
- gift bags (if coated, laminated, dyed)
- anything on a tree

Twelve Ways to Prevent the Flu

Flu season is mainly a fall and winter virus. It changes from year to year and spreads easily. It infects the nose, throat and lungs. Symptoms include fever, chills, sore throat, cough, stuffy nose, fatigue, headache and muscle ache. However, there are ways that the flu can be prevented.

1. Get immunized each year. A yearly flu vaccine is the best protection against seasonal flu. The vaccine is recommended for people 6 months of age and older.
2. Wash your hands. Do it often and do it well. Use soap and water. Scrub all surfaces for at least 20 seconds.
3. Use alcohol-based hand sanitizer. Use it any time soap and water are not available. Make sure the hand sanitizer is at least 60% alcohol.
4. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. The flu virus can live on other people's hands or on surfaces. It can get on your hands if you touch that person or thing. Then the virus can enter your body if you touch your eyes, nose or mouth before washing.
5. Cover coughs and sneezes. Use a tissue. Then wash your hands.
6. Clean and disinfect regularly. This can help kill the flu virus on surfaces. Focus on areas that are touched often. Some examples: kitchen counters, bather faucets, door knobs, telephones, handrails and keyboards.
7. Take care of yourself. Healthy habits can help boost your immune system. Get plenty of sleep. Eat a variety of healthy foods every day. Drink plenty of water. Get regular physical activity. Manage your stress: take breaks and try relaxation techniques.
8. Keep your distance from sick people. If a family member has the flu, wash your hands often. Try to avoid crowded place and public gatherings as much as possible.
9. Don't share personal items. Avoid sharing: eating utensils, towels, cups or straws, toothbrushes.
10. Teach children good hygiene habits. School age children are more likely to catch and spread the flu. Teach them how to: properly cover coughs and sneezes. Wash hands well (20 seconds).
11. If you have the flu, avoid spreading it. Stay home while you are sick. Generally, this is until at least 24 hours after a fever is gone. Follow your health provider's advice. Take any medication exactly as prescribed.
12. Prepare for the next flu pandemic. Keep an emergency kit stocked with food, water and other supplies to last for at least 2 weeks in case of a severe pandemic. A kit can help if you must stay home or if supplies run low.

Lock It or Lose It

It takes 3 things for a crime to occur: desire, ability and opportunity. Neither the police, nor the community can rid a criminal of his desire or his ability. However, there are things we can do to eliminate his opportunity. By locking doors and windows and securing valuables out of sight, it removes the opportunity for a thief to burglarize your home or vehicle.

It takes a thief less than 30 seconds to break into a car, take an item left in plain sight, check the usual hiding places (glove box, center console, under the seat) and get away. Most thefts occur when someone leaves their car unlocked and/or leave valuable items

where a would-be thief can see it. If a thief steals items with identification in it, you may also become a victim of identity theft.

To keep your vehicle and valuables safe, follow these quick prevention tips.

- Lock the doors and take the key with you.
- Lock valuable items, packages and shopping bags in the trunk or take them with you.
- Park in your garage or in a secure, well lit location.

Residential burglaries occur when a criminal gains access to a home or garage through an unlocked door or window. Entering through an unlocked door requires little effort, creates far less noise and attracts much less attention than breaking a window or forcing a door open. Make your home and property less inviting by locking doors and windows and keeping overhead doors in the down position. A well placed motion sensor light may also be a valuable asset.

Disposing of Holiday Trees and Refuse

Christmas trees placed at the curb on your regular refuse collection day during the first and second week in January will be picked up without a refuse sticker. After that, please put the required sticker on the trees. All ornaments, lights and nails must be removed. Trees may not be placed in plastic bags. Wrapping paper, packing peanuts, garlands and wreaths may be included with regular refuse. Boxes may be recycled if they measure no more than three feet by three feet and have been flattened.


Dollars and Sense

That's Not Mickey Mouse at City Hall?

You may have seen the union "rat" placed at City Hall over the past few months. The rat has been sponsored by various unions over the course of the final build out of the old police station space at City Hall.

The basis for the union's placing of the rat is the fact that the low bidder on this project is not unionized. The City of Northlake has no control over whether or not a contractor is unionized or not. The City must accept the lowest bid from a contractor who pledges to pay the prevailing wage, which is the case in the current situation.

For the record, the City of Northlake is not against construction unions or unions in general. The \$9 million dollar Police Station was built with union contractors and the millions of dollars spent on roadwork and water system

improvements since 1997 were all done with union contractors.

The City provided incentives for the construction of two data centers which provided work for hundreds of union workers and was the first suburb to support the O'Hare modernization program which has also provided hundreds of union jobs. The City is also supporting the construction of the western bypass around O'Hare Airport, which will also provide hundreds of union jobs.

Beat The Cold

Winter officially began on December 21, however, the cold and snow began long before that date. The cold weather can cause health and safety problems if you are not prepared. The following tips are common sense solutions to some of winter's potential problems.

- Wear layers of warm, dry clothing including hat and gloves. Wet clothing takes away the insulating effect.
- Cover exposed skin surfaces as protection from frostbite (numbness, red nose, chin, fingers, forehead, stiff checks) warm gradually by wrapping or placing next to warm skin. Do not rub affected areas.
- Be aware of hypothermia (body temperature 95 degrees or less). Stiff muscles, puffy face, slowed breathing, poor physical condition, mental confusion. If these signs are recognized, call 911 immediately.
- Drink non-alcoholic beverages such as tea, coffee, hot chocolate and soup.
- Maintain good nutrition and get plenty of rest.
- Prescription drugs may increase vulnerability to cold. Check with your pharmacist or doctor.
- Be aware of elderly and disabled persons living alone. Offer assistance.
- It is dangerous to use an oven as a heating device. All space heaters are a fire risk if used improperly.

Individuals 65 and older should obtain a flu shot every year.

Police Department School Walk and Talk Partnership

The mission for the Northlake Police Department in 2009 seemed simple:




