



Survey Says: "Continue Northlake Days"

The August water bill contained a survey form concerning Northlake Days. We received 276 responses, roughly 10% of the surveys which were sent out. By a little better than a 2 to 1 margin, the sentiment was to continue Northlake Days in the same format.

Here is a breakdown of each survey questions.

1. Should Northlake Days continue in the same format as in the past several years?
Yes – 165 No – 72

2. Should Northlake Days be scaled down to just a one day event with fireworks in the evening, preceded with a band performance and a Bring Your Own Picnic? (No carnival, booths, etc.)
Circle One:
Yes – 77 No – 157

3. Should the City combine with Leyden

Township for one fireworks display at West Leyden High School? Circle one.
Yes – 79 No – 150

4. Should Northlake cancel the event altogether? Circle one.
Yes – 48 No – 202

Rebate Available for Pet Neutering

You don't need to miss an opportunity to help control the pet population in our area! The City of Northlake will give you \$20.00 for neutering your dog or cat at any time during the year. Just bring proof of the neutering from your vet into Northlake City Hall after your pet has been neutered and we'll send you a check for the \$20.00.

CFL Safety and Disposal

Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) consume much less power and last much longer than comparable incandescent bulbs. CFLs, however, contain a small amount of toxic mercury, sealed within the glass tubing. No mercury is released when the bulbs are intact or in use, but they should be handled carefully while being removed from packaging and installed or replaced. Always screw and unscrew the bulb by its base rather than by the glass. Never forcefully twist a CFL into a light socket. When a CFL breaks, some of the mercury is released as mercury vapor. To minimize exposure, follow these EPA-recommended clean up steps. Before clean up, have all people and pets leave the room. Ventilate the room by opening a window or door for at least 15 minutes. Shut off your central air conditioning or heating. When it is safe to return to the room, put on protective gloves and thoroughly scrape up broken glass and visible powder using stiff paper or cardboard. Use sticky tape to pick up remaining fragments or powder. Never use a vacuum to clean up debris from a broken bulb. Seal the glass and powder tightly in a glass jar or plastic bag. Wash your hands with soap and water after clean up. Broken CFLs are legally considered a hazardous material and may not be disposed of with regular refuse. Burned out, unbroken CFLs are accepted for recycling at Home Depot.

Reminder Abouts Tents

Tents, defined as any portable structure, including sunscreens, with or without walls, made of canvas or other like materials, need to be dismantled from the front yard between Memorial Day and Labor Day. These structures need to be dismantled from areas other than the front yard between April 1 and November 1. This ordinance, O-16-2002, includes poles, stakes, wires and ropes.

SNOW REMOVAL APPLICATION FORM



The City of Northlake offers snow removal services to property owners who are disabled, handicapped and/or have severe health problems and have no one else who is able to help them with snow removal. Those interested in snow removal must re-apply every year. Deadline is November 9th. No exceptions. Be sure to turn in your completed application and doctor verification to City Hall before November 9th, 2012 . New applicants must submit medical verification from a doctor to City hall in order to be eligible. Billing is \$10 per removal.

Remember: The snow plow will make one pass only on your drive way.





Complimentary Rides for
Recreation and Shopping

We provide free rides to: Target, Wal-Mart, Beauty/Barber Shops, Senior Clubs, Post Office, Banks, Grocery Stores, North Riverside Mall, (Oakbrook and Yorktown Malls are on Mondays ONLY)

Ride reservations can be made for Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m., (except holidays and when the Township offices are closed).

Due to traffic inconsistencies, clients are required to be ready 15-minutes prior to their scheduled pick-up time and to watch for the Township car. The driver will stop at the designated address and wait briefly (5-minutes), if there is no response, the driver will leave. Our drivers are not allowed to go inside a client's home.

Scheduling Procedures:

- Call (708/344-8801) for reservations. Multiple stops are not allowed.
- You must call by 12:00 noon, the previous day, to reserve your appointment.
- If you are going shopping, you are allowed no more than two (2) packages.
- The rider cannot reserve travel to one location and change it with the driver.
- Each rider can have one (1) round trip per day – two (2) times per week.
- Free car transportation is provided for Proviso Township residents who are:
 - 60 years of age and older
 - Mentally challenged, who can't operate a motorized vehicle

Due to Insurance Regulations:

- Individuals, who are not physically and/or mentally able to get from their house to the car and destination by themselves, will not be transported unless accompanied by another individual who can assist them.
- Smoking is prohibited in all Township cars.
- Passengers MUST wear **seatbelts, at all times**, in Township vehicles; **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Those who cannot will forfeit their free ride.



Speaker Madigan has hinted that the issue will not be addressed until the beginning of the next session which will convene during January of 2013. After a mid-August special session was called by the Governor, it became evident that the Speaker was not serious about any attempt to resolve the current pension debate.

As the Governor and Republican House Leadership are calling for a compromise, Madigan continues to stand stubborn with a no-compromise attitude calling for the tax shift to burden Illinois suburban homeowners rather than the State take responsibility for its own bills. We must work sooner rather than later in attempting to find a solution to our unfunded pension liability and make sure we arrive at a solution that is more than a temporary band aid.

Portable Generator Safety

When using a portable generator during a power outage, it is important to remember that they can be dangerous if used incorrectly. Like all internal combustion engines, generators produce carbon monoxide and must be properly ventilated. Never use a generator indoors or near windows, doors or vents. Do not operate the generator inside the garage, even if the door is open. To avoid electrical shock or electrocution, keep the generator dry and never attach it directly to the home's electrical system without a properly installed transfer switch. Use only undamaged, heavy-duty, three pronged extension cords. Never store fuel indoors and always shut off the generator before refueling.






