

Inoperable Vehicles Prohibited



Make a Fire Escape Plan

In the event of a fire, remember, time is the biggest enemy and every second counts. Escape plans help you get out of your home quickly. In less than 30 seconds, a small flame can get completely out of control and turn into a major fire. It only takes minutes for a house to fill with thick black smoke and become engulfed in flames.

- Practice escape plans every month.
- Plan two ways out of each room.
- Immediately leave your home when a fire occurs.
- Never open doors that are hot to the touch.
- Designate a meeting location away from your home.
- Once you're out, stay out!

Having working smoke alarms installed on every level of your home dramatically increases your chances of survival. Smoke alarm batteries need to be tested every month and changed with new ones at least once a year. Also, consider replacing the entire smoke alarm every ten years, or as the manufacturer guidelines recommend

A Guide to Safe Winter Driving

With the winter season in full swing, it's good to be prepared for driving in these less than perfect conditions. Here are some tips that may prove helpful when driving in the winter months.

- Have your car inspected and fully winterized prior to the winter season. Pay particular attention to our battery connections, charging system, defroster, tires, brakes, anti-freeze, wiper blades and belts.
- During the winter months, try not to go below a half a tank of fuel. This prevents condensation from building up in your vehicles fuel line and freezing, It also ensures that you will have enough fuel to run your vehicle's heater in the event of any emergency.
- Check your local weather and road conditions before heading out. Give yourself plenty of time to get to your destination.
- If traveling a long distance, plan your route ahead of time. Let someone know your destination, route and expected time of arrival.
- Always make sure you and your passengers wear seat belts.
- Slow down whenever crossing bridges and overpasses, these roadways tend to freeze first. Avoid any sudden changes of speed or direction as you drive over them.
- Keep windows, mirrors, wiper blades, headlights, taillights and license plates free of snow and ice. This will ensure that you can both see and be seen.
- Know how to handle your vehicle: front or rear wheel drive. Leave a larger space between you and other vehicles.
- If you become stuck or stranded, don't panic. Stay with your vehicle for safety and warmth. Wait for help to arrive. If you have a cell phone, call for help. Be careful if you have to exit your vehicle when on the shoulder of a busy road. If possible, use the door away from traffic. Dress warmly, shovel slowly and do not overexert yourself. Do Not attempt to shovel or push your vehicle if you have a medical condition.
- Try to draw attention to your vehicle by using emergency flashers, flares or "Call Police" sign in your window.
- Run your motor sparingly and be careful of exhaust fumes. For fresh air, only slightly open a window away from the wind.
- Keep a winter survival kit in your car for emergencies.

City of Chicago Unilaterally Raises Water Rates to Suburbs

Effective January 1, 2013, the City of Chicago increased the cost of water to the City of Northlake by 15%. This unilateral dictate forces the City of Northlake to raise its rates to residents by 9.9%. The new rate will be \$6.67 per thousand gallons up from \$6.07 per thousand gallons.

Wipers and Lights

Motorists are reminded that Illinois Vehicle Code 12-201(b) requires the use of headlights, not only from sunset to sunrise, but also any time snow, rain, ice, or other weather conditions require the use of windshield wipers. Headlights must also be used any time a person or vehicle on the highway is not clearly visible at a distance of 1,000 feet.

Placing Trash at Curb

Residents are reminded that trash may not be placed on the parkway before 5 p.m. the evening before the scheduled pick-up, which is Friday morning, unless there is a holiday during the week, when pick up will be on Saturday. Containers must be removed from the parkway by 5:00 p.m.

Trees Available for 2013 Planting Season

Trees for the 2013 spring or fall planting are available. As a matter of fact, you can make a request for a tree to be planted during any time in the next 5 years. If you have room on your parkway to provide a home for a tree, call Public Works at 708-562-0940 to pick from the list of trees for planting.

Remember, trees located on the parkway or in the City's right of way cannot be cut or trimmed without permission from the City. The right of way is generally the area 20 feet from the back of the curb. If in doubt, or if a tree in this area needs attention, call Public Works at 708-562-0940.

We provide free rides to: Target, Wal-Mart, Beauty/Barber Shops, Senior Clubs, Post Office, Banks, Grocery Stores, North Riverside Mall, (Oakbrook and Yorktown Malls are on Mondays ONLY)

Ride reservations can be made for Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m., (except holidays and when the Township offices are closed).

Due to traffic inconsistencies, clients are required to be ready 15-minutes prior to their scheduled pick-up time and to watch for the Township car. The driver will stop at the designated address and wait briefly (5-minutes), if there is no response, the driver will leave. Our drivers are not allowed to go inside a client's home.

Scheduling Procedures:

- Call (708/344-8801) for reservations. Multiple stops are not allowed.
- You must call by 12:00 noon, the previous day, to reserve your appointment.
- If you are going shopping, you are allowed no more than two (2) packages.
- The rider cannot reserve travel to one location and change it with the driver.
- Each rider can have one (1) round trip per day – two (2) times per week.
- Free car transportation is provided for Proviso Township residents who are:
 - 60 years of age and older
 - Mentally challenged, who can't operate a motorized vehicle

Due to Insurance Regulations:

- Individuals, who are not physically and/or mentally able to get from their house to the car and destination by themselves, will not be transported unless accompanied by another individual who can assist them.
- Smoking is prohibited in all Township cars.
- Passengers **MUST** wear **seatbelts, at all times**, in Township vehicles; **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Those who cannot will forfeit their free ride.

Pace Offers Options for Those Looking to Avoid Paying at the Pump






