Summer Safety Reminders

Each year over 50 children die because they were left alone in a car during warm weather.

- A child should never be left in a car unattended, even with the windows slightly open. The temperature can reach 140 degrees very quickly.
- Teach children to never play in any vehicle or in the trunk of a vehicle.
- Call 911 immediately if you see an unattended child in a car. Fire Department professionals are trained to determine if a child is in trouble.

Water safety Reminders

Children drown quickly and quietly. Many of these accidents can be avoided by not being distracted by phones, reading, and conversations around the pool.

- Never leave a child unattended at a pool, not even for a second. Have a cellphone nearby to call 911 in an emergency.
- If you own a pool, make sure it has a four-sided fence and a self-closing, self-latching gate. Remove the ladder if the pool is not in use.
- Hot tubs should be covered and locked when not in use.
- Drowning victims need CPR right away, even before the paramedics can get there – Learn CPR.
- Enroll your child in swim lessons. Children from families that do not swim are more likely to drown.
- If you go boating, have your child wear a life jacket every time. Nine out of ten people that drown during a boating accident are not wearing a life jacket. Alcohol is involved in one of every five boating fatalities.

Single Cup Coffee Pods are Not Recyclable

I came across an article in the Waste and Recycling News publication recently concerning single cup coffee pods, such as the K cup. One of the interesting facts was that in 2010, 4% of U.S. adults drank coffee from a single cup brewer every day, but that number had increased to 13% by 2013. That translates to 5 billion coffee pods for 2013 alone.

Most single cup coffee pods consist of a combination of plastic, aluminum, organic material and paper. All of these items are recyclable separately, but when combined, can not be recycled at the municipal level. The industry is working on the problem and some companies, such as Tassimo, Mars, Nespresso and Illy have come up with take back programs for used pods diverting millions of pods from landfill.

Sure, coffee pods such as the K cup are convenient, but at what cost? How much non-renewable resources, such as fossil fuel derived plastics are being consumed without recycling?

Manufacturers of all consumer items need to come up with end of life solution for their products as enthusiastically as they come up with new products and count their profits. This applies to everyone: electronics, paint, carpeting, building materials, and furniture, to name a few, not just coffee pod manufacturers.

Everyone had a good time on the two motor coach buses playing bingo. A total of 87 people went on this trip.


The Commission also sponsored a Night at the Races at Maywood Race Track on May 23. This included admission, a program and dinner. A total of 21 people attended this event.

Be a Responsible Pet Owner

Pet owners should be aware of the following City ordinances:

1. Clean up after pets when walking them on public sidewalks or parkways or in City parks.
2. Don't allow pets to trespass on private



property anywhere in the City.

3. When off its owner's property, a dog must be properly restrained by means of a leash or chain, six feet or less in length, attached to the collar or harness.
4. Dogs and cats must be licensed and registered annually. They must also have a valid rabies tag affixed to their collars.
5. Never leave a barking dog outside to annoy neighbors. Excessive barking is considered a nuisance under city ordinances and may result in a citation.
6. No more than 3 dogs, cats of combination of the two can be kept on any property within the City, with the exception of a litter of puppies or kittens, which can be kept for no more than four months after birth.
7. Violations may result in a ticket and a court-ordered fine of up to \$1,000.

Did you know that the City has a dog bite ordinance?

Any dog that bites a person or another animal must wear a muzzle and a special dog tag. A placard must be placed in the front window of your residence.




Help Fight Mosquitoes

It's a fact... mosquitoes develop in water.

Over 40 different species of mosquito occur within Illinois. Each species has its own developmental habitat, however all mosquitoes need water in which to pass their early life stages. Some mosquitoes lay their eggs directly on the surface of water. Other mosquitoes lay their eggs in areas that will eventually fill with water. Once eggs come in contact with water, they hatch into larvae within 3–5 days. Mosquito larvae undergo four stages of growth and development called instars. Larvae feed on organic material and microorganisms in the water and return to the surface of the water to breathe. Larval development may be as rapid as 5–7 days in warm weather. After the larval stages are complete, the larvae shed their skins and emerge as comma-shaped pupae. Pupae are very active and dive vigorously if disturbed. Pupae do not feed while they undergo metamorphosis to the adult stage. The adult mosquito emerges from the pupal skin and rests on the water's surface until it dries.

Both male and female adult mosquitoes feed on plant nectar, but only the female bites to get the blood needed for the development of eggs. While some kinds of mosquitoes can live several months, the main nuisance mosquitoes we have in this area usually survive four weeks or less. Not all mosquitoes can carry disease, nor are all mosquitoes vicious biters. Some kinds of mosquito never bite humans. Mosquitoes also vary in the distances they travel from the water they developed in. While some species will not stray more than a block or two from their source, other species' flight range can be 20 miles or more.



Here's what you can do...

It doesn't take much water for mosquitoes to develop. Many potential breeding sites can be found around the home. You can take the following simple steps to eliminate potential sources:

- Throw away all trash that can hold water (cans, jars, tires, etc).
- Clean rain gutters and downspouts to prevent water from standing in gutters or on flat roofs.
- Change water in bird baths, wading pools, etc. at least once a week. Maintain swimming pools properly.
- Keep ditches and streams on or around your property free of grass clippings, garbage, and other debris to insure proper flow of water.
- Screen rain barrels with 16-mesh screen to prevent adult mosquitoes from depositing eggs on the water's surface.
- Stock ornamental ponds with goldfish or other surface-feeding fish to control mosquito production.
- Clean out and fill tree holes.
- Stack pails, barrels, tubs and similar containers upside down.

Grass Height

Homeowners can help keep our community and their neighborhoods neat and attractive during the summer and fall months by regularly mowing their lawns. Northlake code requires that lawns be maintained at a height of 8 inches or less. Grass that is allowed to grow longer than 8 inches is considered a nuisance and can result in a fine.

Please remember to call 1-800-892-0123 at least 48 hours before you plan to do any digging on

your property. J.U.L.I.E. will give you the location of underground utility lines.

Construction Safety

Construction sites often attract children, but they can be very dangerous and are not appropriate places for children to play. Parents are reminded to keep their children safely away from construction areas, especially dug-out basements and foundations.

Home By Curfew

Teens are reminded that curfew for young people under the age of 17 is 10:30 p.m. Sunday through

Thursday and 11:30 p.m. Fridays and Saturdays. During curfew hours, any minor in a public area must be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or responsible companion at least 21 years of age and approved by the teen's parent or legal guardian. An exception is made for teens engaged in a business or occupation which Illinois laws authorize a person under 18 to perform. Teens and parents are reminded that the driver's license of a 16 year old is not valid if the driver is in violation of Illinois curfew hours.

Garage Sales

A garage sale is a great way to get rid of unwanted items and make a little extra cash. Northlake residents are allowed to hold up to two garage sales a year. This does not include the City Wide Garage Sale in September. Permits are required. You must register at City Hall. Signs advertising the sale must be removed by the end of the last day of your sale. There is a \$50 fine for not removing your signs.

Block Parties



Vehicle Sticker Reminder

Owners of vehicles registered in Northlake are required to get a city sticker for the car. There is no fee for the sticker, however, if you are cited for not having a sticker, there is a fine of \$50.00. Come to City Hall, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. or Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to noon to get a sticker for your vehicle(s).

Remember, trees located on the parkway or in the City's right of way cannot be cut or trimmed without permission from the City. The right of way is generally the area 20 feet from the back of the curb. If in doubt, or if a tree in this area needs attention, call Public Works at 708-562-0940.



Just Hang Up!

The Best Way to Avoid Telephone Scams Is Also the Easiest.

Every day, seniors throughout Illinois fall prey to smooth-talking con artists who call them up and tell all kinds of convincing stories to get their money.

The Office of the Illinois Attorney General wants you to know that it's shrewd, not rude, to hang up the phone when a stranger asks you to send them money or give out your personal information.

The following are some common warning signs of telephone scams. If you spot any of these signs while on the phone, don't think twice:

Just Hang Up!

THEY CONTACT YOU. When you look up the number of a reputable business on your own and call to place an order, you have a good idea who's on the other end of the deal. But when the tables are turned and someone calls you, you have no way of knowing who the person really is, where they're calling from, or what they want from you. **Just Hang Up!**

THEY WANT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION. Any time a stranger asks you for your bank account number, Social Security number, or other sensitive information, you should be on high alert. This is a sure sign of identity theft. **Never** give personal or financial information to someone you do not know. **Just Hang Up!**



Just Hang Up!

THEY PROMISE A BIG AWARD. Scammers try to lure you in with promises of unexpected riches such as a large sum of money, a vacation, or a "get rich quick" investment scheme. Remember: if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. **Just Hang Up!**

YOU MUST PAY THEM FIRST. It is illegal for someone to require an up-front payment to claim a lottery or sweepstakes prize. Scammers will often tell you that you must wire money out of state, or even out of the country, to obtain your winnings. **Never** wire money to a stranger. Wiring money is just like sending cash—scammers will get the money quickly, and you won't get it back. **Just Hang Up!**

Consider placing your phone number on the **National Do Not Call Registry**, if you haven't already done so. This will block most unwanted telemarketing calls. So, once your number is on the registry, you'll know that any telemarketer who does call you is probably up to no good. You can register your home phone or cell phone online at www.donotcall.gov or by calling 1-888-382-1222 (TTY: 1-866-290-4236) from the phone number you wish to register.

Development Does Not Alter Drainage Patterns


When Northlake was developed in the late 1940's and early 1950's, the area consisted of farmland drained by a network of creeks which all drained to either Silver Creek to the north or Addison Creek to the west and south.

As development took place, there was little or no regulation concerning drainage, flood plains or wet lands. As a result, many of the tributaries of Addison and Silver Creeks were either filled in, encapsulated in sewer pipes and re-routed, or built upon.

These tributaries occurred in naturally low-lying areas which collected storm water and drained it to the creeks. These collectors were filled in and developed, but the surrounding land remained at the original lower level. The map which highlights this drainage system is from 1953. Flash forward 60 years to 2013 and many of these same areas are the same ones which were subjected to flooding during the record breaking rains of April, as if the 1953 map suddenly re-appeared, if only for a short time.

Unfortunately, we have to live with the consequences of the poor planning of 60 years ago. The City is taking steps to try to undo the worst of this, but many times, you cannot bend the forces of nature to your will. As outlined in last month's paper, the City will be taking corrective action along Addison Creek from Wolf Road to Palmer. The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District will also be making improvements north of Fullerton Avenue. The City is also continuing its flood mitigation efforts along Addison Creek south of North Avenue.

I would like to think that we have learned from past mistakes. You certainly could not simply fill in a creek and build on it today, and we are much more cognizant of drainage issues in 2013. Hopefully our decisions of today will have a positive effect 60 years from now, unlike the decisions concerning drainage that were made in 1953 and earlier.



Emergency Notification Systems

The City of Northlake provides its residents, business and visitors with emergency notifications in the event of emergency situations or during other situations that may warrant community notification, such as major or prolonged weather events, or prolonged disruptions of city services. These notifications are meant to provide information that is critical to the safety and well-being of Northlake residents and visitors. Notifications are provided via a telephone notification system that will dial each telephone number in our system within the affected area and provide the person who answers with any pertinent information regarding the emergency. These notifications are not intended to replace critical time-sensitive information that is provided via the Emergency Alert System, which is broadcast via television and radio stations, along with NOAA Weather Radio.

FAQ's

Who is already in the Emergency Notification System?

Persons who have "traditional" wireline telephone service even if you have an unlisted phone number.

Who should register their home or business phone in the Emergency Notification System?

Those who have landline telephone service provided by services that use the IP network to move voice data such as Vonage, Comcast, Magic Jack, and other companies need to register their home telephone number in order to receive alerts from our system..

If I want notifications to my wireless phone (cell phone), must I register my number?

YES, you must register your cell phone if you want messages sent to it! Wireless telephone numbers are not automatically included in our system and must be registered by the phone's owner. PLEASE NOTE that during times of widespread emergency situations, cellular telephone networks may be overloaded and messages may not be sent by the wireless carriers in a timely manner.

Will emergency notifications to my cell phone be based on my address, or my current location?

Notifications sent to cell phones will be based upon the address that was used when the cell phone was registered in the system.

Notifications will not be based upon the phone's current location due to limitations in currently available technology.

How do I sign up?

Go to the City of Northlake website northlakecity.com and click on the Global Connect tab under the city seal on the right-hand side of the page. A sign up box will appear that will allow you to enter your notification information

What if I don't have the internet?

Because information is password sensitive it's recommended that a family member or trusted friend provided you with internet access. If you do not have internet access a City of Northlake staff member can enter your information by using the form below and dropping it off at City Hall.
