## **Intergovernmental Cooperation Results in Flood Control Projects for Northlake**

**T**he City of Northlake, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District and the Addison Creek River Conservancy District have come together to fund the construction of a multifaceted flood control project for Addison Creek.

The project, which should get under way next year, will involve the removal of the two dams in Addison Creek, removal of built up silt and returning the Creek to its more natural configuration.

The end result will be improvement of water quality, increased flood capacity, elimination of stream bank erosion and removal of invasive vegetation species and improvement of aquatic habitat.

The MWRD will contribute up to \$1 million of the \$3 million project, with the remainder to be split between the City and the Creek District. The City of Northlake will act as the lead agency on this project and will be responsible for bidding and construction of the job.

Due to this interagency cooperation, Northlake residents will benefit from increased flood capacity once this project is completed.

The City has a good track record with intergovernmental projects. The park areas at Whittier and Riley Schools were made possible as a result of intergovernmental agreements between the City, School District 87 and the Veteran's and Memorial Park Districts. The Midland Trail is a result of an intergovernmental agreement between the City and Veteran's Park District. The mosquito abatement program is a result of an intergovernmental agreement between Northlake and Leyden Township. Intergovernmental cooperation and coordination is the key to providing benefits for the greater good for all residents served by the maze of local government rather than each entity acting as an island on their own.

# Kathleen Willis State Representative 77th District

As I write this column, we are in the final throws of the Spring legislative session. Many major issues remain unresolved, including our efforts to reform the pension system, craft a responsible budget, and institute a concealed carry version that protects the safety of our neighborhoods. I look forward to providing you with a recap of legislative developments next month, but for now, I wanted to focus on what I view as one of my most important duties as your representative: listening.

I believe that the role of an elected official is to take the concerns of their constituents and put them into action. That is my mission and I fully accept it because it's impossible to take the votes that I am taking without fully considering the feedback of the people who sent me to Springfield.

One of my favorite ways to listen is to walk door-to-door—not to ask for votes, but rather to ask for your opinion on the challenges the state is facing. So, expect to see me in your neighborhood soon. In the same respect, I try to make a lot of phone calls—particularly as we are debating bills on the House Floor. It's very important for me to understand how the legislation we are considering will impact my constituents, so I'll oftentimes just pick up the phone and call folks to ask for their thoughts.

Another way that I solicit input is through my Citizen Advisory Committees, which are informal groups of constituents who care about a certain topic. At our meetings, I like to highlight some legislation on a specific subject matter and then ask for opinions, as well as take a survey of our major challenges and then brainstorm ways to address them.

Next month, several of these committees will meet, and I invite anyone and everyone to stop by. There's no pressure—you don't have to be an expert to attend. All of these meetings will be held at my constituent service office, located at 112 N. Wolf Road in Northlake. Please stop by and share your thoughts.

## City Receives Final Installment of City Hall Grant


The City of Northlake received the final installment of the grant for the renovation of the space formerly occupied by the Northlake Police Department. The grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce and



Economic Opportunity (DCEO) was in the amount of \$500,000.00. The work was completed for the amount of \$523,000.00. The final result was a new City Council Chamber which functions as a multipurpose room and new offices for the building department, Police Commission and Police Pension Board.

The City received the 2013 "Greentelligence" Award from the West Central Municipal Conference for the project. The City had also received a "Greentelligence" Award from the WCMC in 2010 for the new police station completed in 2010.

## Trees Available for 2013 Planting Season

Trees for the 2013 spring or fall planting are available. As a matter of fact, you can make a request for a tree to be planted during any time in the next 5 years. If you have room on your parkway to provide a home for a tree, call Public Works at 708-562-0940 to pick from the list of trees for planting.

Remember, trees located on the parkway or in the City's right of way cannot be cut or trimmed without permission from the City. The right of way is generally the area 20 feet from the back of the curb. If in doubt, or if a tree in this area needs attention, call Public Works at 708-562-0940.

## Just Hang Up!

The Best Way to Avoid Telephone Scams Is Also the Easiest.

Every day, seniors throughout Illinois fall prey to smooth-talking con artists who call them up and tell all kinds of convincing stories to get their money.

The Office of the Illinois Attorney General wants you to know that it's shrewd, not rude, to hang up the phone when a stranger asks you to send them money or give out your personal information.

The following are some common warning signs of telephone scams. If you spot any of these signs while on the phone, don't think twice:

### Just Hang Up!

**THEY CONTACT YOU.** When you look up the number of a reputable business on your own and call to place an order, you have a good idea who's on the other end of the deal. But when the tables are turned and someone calls you, you have no way of knowing who the person really is, where they're calling from, or what they want from you. *Just Hang Up!*

**THEY WANT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION.** Any time a stranger asks you for your bank account number, Social Security number, or other sensitive information, you should be on high alert. This is a sure sign of identity theft. *Never* give personal or financial information to someone you do not know. *Just Hang Up!*



### Just Hang Up!

**THEY PROMISE A BIG AWARD.** Scammers try to lure you in with promises of unexpected riches such as a large sum of money, a vacation, or a "get rich quick" investment scheme. Remember: if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. *Just Hang Up!*

**YOU MUST PAY THEM FIRST.** It is illegal for someone to require an up-front payment to claim a lottery or sweepstakes prize. Scammers will often tell you that you must wire money out of state, or even out of the country, to obtain your winnings. *Never* wire money to a stranger. Wiring money is just like sending cash—scammers will get the money quickly, and you won't get it back. *Just Hang Up!*

Consider placing your phone number on the **National Do Not Call Registry**, if you haven't already done so. This will block most unwanted telemarketing calls. So, once your number is on the registry, you'll know that any telemarketer who does call you is probably up to no good. 

# New Runway Configuration to Benefit Northlake

Work is progressing on the O'Hare Modernization Plan (OMP) with a new east-west runway to be commissioned in October of this year. Work is also progressing on the new south runway slated to open in October, 2015.

Once the new runways are completed and operating, use of the existing runway, 22L, will diminish dramatically. Runway 22L accounts for the air traffic over Northlake with as much as 1/3 of all departures using this runway. We are looking forward to quieter skies after over 50 years of aircraft noise. The City of Northlake has supported this project since it was first conceived in 1997. In addition to relief from aircraft noise, a modernized and expanded O'Hare will secure the area's economy.



# Small Town Prices to Match

## Northlake Has Long Been a Draw for Working-Class Families

Over the years, they have been remodeled and remuddled — a front porch here, new siding there. But the rows of 1940s houses that gave its pioneers a Hobson's choice (Cape Cod or Cape Cod) still define west suburban Northlake.

Sold as empty shells by Midland Development Co., the "Midlands" provided housing for workers at a Buick plant in Melrose Park. Residents added electricity and plumbing and built bedrooms on the second floors.

"Northlake was built backwards," said Mayor Jeff Sherwin, whose parents and in-laws were Midland buyers. Instead of starting with an infrastructure, houses came first.

"Every house had a septic field, and we got water from a central well," he said. "Then we added a sewer system, sidewalks and curbs, paved the streets and got Lake Michigan water."

"North Lake" (from North Avenue and Lake Street) became "Northlake" after 561 people voted to incorporate the Cook County city in 1949.

"Election was tense but calm," read a local paper.



The "Proud Union Home" yard signs leave no doubt; this is a working-class town with hard-working folks. While it lacks leafy canopies that older suburbs enjoy, Northlake's streetscapes are tidy (no front fences allowed) and its lots generous.

The Northlake that commuters see from Interstate Highway 294 morphed from mom-and-pop businesses to goliaths, including Microsoft Corp.'s data center and a bottling plant that supplies the Chicago area with Snapple, 7-Up and Dr. Pepper.

Add the strip of big-box stores on North Avenue, and you have a solid tax base and commercial areas that buffer the residential section. The multiple trains and airplanes around O'Hare International Airport are "a blessing and curse," said Sherwin, because they bring business to town but generate noise.

Now the city's population of 12,300 is a mix of old-timers with Northern European roots who still own their Midlands and younger, mostly Hispanic buyers lured by prices of Midlands needing facelifts.

Buyers on budgets find housing at the 600-unit King Arthur Apartments and Condominiums. Those who want to share their digs with tenants own Northlake's two dozen two-flats.

Real estate taxes are \$300 to \$400 lower for homes in the unincorporated area on the city's northeast side, whose addresses also read "Northlake."

If a lot lacks sidewalks, it is unincorporated.

Northlake has plenty of housing for seniors who want to stay put, said Nancy LaPaglia, a retired medical researcher, who was playing Bingo with her husband, and their friends.

"My father built his house here in 1945, then built ours in 1956," she said. Many of their peers live in Northlake's senior housing, which includes Casa San Carlo Retirement Community apartments, Concord Place Retirement & Assisted Living Community and Villa Scalabrini Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

"Northlake is senior-friendly and safe for those of us who walk a lot," said LaPaglia. "If you have a problem and call city hall, they call you back."

At the other end of Northlake's demographics is Leandra Kozak, a 36-year-old engine assembler who bought a condo at the city-owned Wolf Ridge Condominiums in 2011. "I'm close to work in Melrose Park, close to Chicago, and on weekends I can walk to the library or park," she said.

Prices start at \$129,900 and include two indoor parking spaces.

Wolf Ridge is an exception. Most condos are older and sell for under \$50,000. Recent single-family house sales range from \$20,000 to \$190,000.

Missing is a downtown and a Metra station, but a stretch of North Avenue is the shopping district. The parks host annual events, including Eggstravaganza in the spring, Boofest in October and Winterfest in December.

The biggest bash is Northlake Days in June, when families flock to a carnival, car show and parade.

Baseball fields fill each spring as youngsters progress from Pintos to Broncos. In local taverns, allegiance is split between the White Sox and Cubs.

In addition to a dog park, Northlake's canine residents appreciate the city's "fire hydrant garden" (colorful old hydrants) — proof that city hall has a sense of humor.

"Meet me at Perry's" means you are headed for Perry's Pizza Joynt. Other popular eateries are Thai, sushi and Chinese restaurants; several taquerias; and Winking Dog Restaurant, where Sherwin suggested "two hot dogs and fries for \$4.53 — how can you beat that?"

The city's Italian roots shine at Ancona Bakery. "On holidays, we're swamped because people buy

the things their mothers used to bake, like cuccidati and tiramisu," said Cheri Buoniconti, wife of third-generation owner, Frank.

Northlake is split into several school districts.



High school kids north of North Avenue attend West Leyden High School in Northlake, while the kids on the south side attend Proviso West High School in Hillside.

You can count on one hand the number of times the suburb has made regional news, including the 1960s escape by a circus elephant and the firing of the city finance director after the 2011 disappearance of \$100,000 in cash from Northlake Days.

To curb violent crime, the police department's Neighborhood Enforcement Team warns gangs to take their business elsewhere and visits parents of gang members.

While city hall's cat, Ginger, watches from her file-cabinet perch, Sherwin, who is running unopposed April 9, ponders his upcoming fifth-term to-

do list: street repaving, luring new businesses while keeping commercial residents happy, and adding mixed-use developments.

"Yes, there have been changes, but they've been for the better," said LaPaglia, as she flicked shut the windows on her Bingo cards. "We have crime, but not like in Chicago." Referencing the city's slogan, "City of Friendly People," she said: "It's true; it really is."

# Emergency Notification Systems

The City of Northlake provides its residents, business and visitors with emergency notifications in the event of emergency situations or during other situations that may warrant community notification, such as major or prolonged weather events, or prolonged disruptions of city services. These notifications are meant to provide information that is critical to the safety and well-being of Northlake residents and visitors. Notifications are provided via a telephone notification system that will dial each telephone number in our system within the affected area and provide the person who answers with any pertinent information regarding the emergency. These notifications are not intended to replace critical time-sensitive information that is provided via the Emergency Alert System, which is broadcast via television and radio stations, along with NOAA Weather Radio.

## FAQ's

### Who is already in the Emergency Notification System?

Persons who have "traditional" wireline telephone service even if you have an unlisted phone number.

Who should register their home or business phone in the Emergency Notification System?

Those who have landline telephone service provided by services that use the IP network to move voice data such as Vonage, Comcast, Magic Jack, and other companies need to register their home telephone number in order to receive alerts from our system..

If I want notifications to my wireless phone (cell phone), must I register my number?

YES, you must register your cell phone if you want messages sent to it! Wireless telephone numbers are not automatically included in our system and must be registered by the phone's owner. PLEASE NOTE that during times of widespread emergency situations, cellular telephone networks may be overloaded and messages may not be sent by the wireless carriers in a timely manner.

Will emergency notifications to my cell phone be based on my address, or my current location?

Notifications sent to cell phones will be based upon the address that was used when the cell phone was registered in the system.

Notifications will not be based upon the phone's current location due to limitations in currently available technology.

### How do I sign up?

Go to the City of Northlake website [northlakecity.com](http://northlakecity.com) and click on the Global Connect tab under the city seal on the right-hand side of the page. A sign up box will appear that will allow you to enter your notification information

### What if I don't have the internet?

Because information is password sensitive it's recommended that a family member or trusted friend provided you with internet access. If you do not have internet access a City of Northlake staff member can enter your information by using the form below and dropping it off at City Hall.
