

SNOW REMOVAL APPLICATION FORM



The City of Northlake offers snow removal services to property owners who are disabled, handicapped and/or have severe health problems and have no one else who is able to help them with snow removal. Those interested in snow removal must re-apply every year. Deadline is November 8th. No exceptions. Be sure to turn in your completed application and doctor verification to City Hall before November 8th, 2013. New applicants must submit medical verification from a doctor to City hall in order to be eligible. Billing is \$10 per removal.

Remember: The snow plow will make one pass only on your drive way.





Portable Generator Safety

When using a portable generator during a power outage, it is important to remember that they can be dangerous if used incorrectly. Like all internal combustion engines, generators produce carbon monoxide and must be properly ventilated. Never use a generator indoors or near windows, doors or vents. Do not operate the generator inside the garage, even if the door is open. To avoid electrical shock or electrocution, keep the generator dry and never attach it directly to the home's electrical system without a properly installed transfer switch. Use only undamaged, heavy-duty, three pronged extension cords. Never store fuel indoors and always shut off the generator before refueling.





Just Hang Up!

The Best Way to Avoid Telephone Scams Is Also the Easiest.

Every day, seniors throughout Illinois fall prey to smooth-talking con artists who call them up and tell all kinds of convincing stories to get their money.


The Office of the Illinois Attorney General wants you to know that it's shrewd, not rude, to hang up the phone when a stranger asks you to send them money or give out your personal information.

The following are some common warning signs of telephone scams. If you spot any of these signs while on the phone, don't think twice:

Just Hang Up!

THEY CONTACT YOU. When you look up the number of a reputable business on your own and call to place an order, you have a good idea who's on the other end of the deal. But when the tables are turned and someone calls you, you have no way of knowing who the person really is, where they're calling from, or what they want from you. **Just Hang Up!**

THEY WANT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION. Any time a stranger asks you for your bank account number, Social Security number, or other sensitive information, you should be on high alert. This is a sure sign of identity theft. **Never** give personal or financial information to someone you do not know. **Just Hang Up!**



Just Hang Up!

THEY PROMISE A BIG AWARD. Scammers try to lure you in with promises of unexpected riches such as a large sum of money, a vacation, or a "get rich quick" investment scheme. Remember: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. **Just Hang Up!**

YOU MUST PAY THEM FIRST. It is illegal for someone to require an upfront payment to claim a lottery or sweepstakes prize. Scammers will often tell you that you must wire money out of state, or even out of the country, to obtain your winnings. **Never** wire money to a stranger. Wiring money is just like sending cash—scammers will get the money quickly, and you won't get it back. **Just Hang Up!**

Consider placing your phone number on the **National Do Not Call Registry**, if you haven't already done so. This will block most unwanted telemarketing calls. So, once your number is on the registry, you'll know that any telemarketer who does call you is probably up to no good. You can register your home phone or cell phone online at www.donotcall.gov or by calling 1-888-382-1222 (TTY: 1-866-290-4236) from the phone number you wish to register.

The 411 on Recycling

The new recycling carts delivered last year to replace the smaller recycling bins have been a success. Many people have commented that the community looks neater and cleaner.

To keep Northlake's recycling program on a successful track, we are asking that you your part. Household waste should never be placed in the recycling carts. Doing so contaminates recyclable materials and the recycling cart will not be emptied.

The system works best when everyone does it correctly. Here are a few reminders about the recycling program:

- Use only the recycling carts that have been provided. However, additional recyclables that do not fit in your cart can be collected in another recycling bin or paper bag.
- All containers to be recycled should be rinsed and free of food, caps and lids
- Broken down cardboard boxes can be placed next to the cart
- DO NOT be use recycling carts for any other type of refuse

Below is a list of items that can be recycled in the Northlake program. Many items that are not accepted may be recycled by other means. Contact city hall at 847-343-8700 for more information.

What Can Be Recycled

- Newspaper
- Mixed Paper: advertisements, direct mail, office paper, stationery, envelopes, paper bags, gift wrap
- Magazines, catalogs and telephone books
- Cardboard and boxboard
- Soda and beer carrying cases
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminum cans and foil
- Tin and steel cans, including empty aerosol cans
- Plastic bottles and containers coded #1- #7 (except #6)
- Six or twelve pack rings
- Milk and juice cartons

What Cannot Be Recycled

- Soiled items such as pizza boxes, napkins and tissues
- Plastic take-out containers, cups, plates, or utensils
- Plastic bags and film
- Styrofoam or packing peanuts
- Disposable diapers or rags
- Needles or syringes
- Mirror and window glass, compact fluorescent and other light bulbs
- Electronic items
- Printer or toner cartridges
- Toys and ceramics
- Motor oil, insecticide and hazardous chemical containers

Electronic items can be dropped off at the Public Works Building, 100 W. Palmer, Monday through Friday, 7:30 to 3:00 p.m.

Northlake Senior Commission Trip

The Northlake Senior Commission sponsored a trip to Blue Chip Casino in Michigan City, Indiana on September 12, 2013. Everyone had a good time on the two motor coach buses playing Bingo. A total of 65 people went on this trip. The Senior Commission tries to have a trip every two or three months for the seniors of Northlake. In addition, every Tuesday, the Commission sponsors Bingo at the Sandy Vasquez Community Center from 12:00 to 3:00. CFL Safety and Disposal

Compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs) consumer much less power and last much longer than comparable incandescent bulbs. CFLs,

however, contain a small amount of toxic mercury, sealed within the glass tubing. No mercury is released when the bulbs are intact or in use, but they should be handled carefully while being removed from packaging and installed or replaced. Always screw and unscrew the bulb by its base rather than by the glass. Never forcefully twist a CFL into a light socket. When a CFL breaks, some of the mercury is released as mercury vapor. To minimize exposure, follow these EPA-recommended clean up steps. Before clean up, have all people and pets leave the room. Ventilate the room by opening a window or door for at least 15 minutes. Shut off your central air conditioning or heating. When it is safe to return to the room, put on protective gloves and thoroughly scrape up broken glass and visible powder using stiff paper or cardboard. Use sticky tape to pick up remaining fragments or powder. Never use a vacuum to clean up debris from a broken bulb. Seal the glass and powder tightly in a glass jar or plastic bag. Wash your hands with soap and water after clean up. Broken CFLs are legally considered a hazardous material and may not be disposed of with regular refuse. Burned out, unbroken CFLs are accepted for recycling at Home Depot.

Do's and Don'ts of Recycling

Do's

- **Do** recycle paper, junk mail, magazines, paper bags, newspaper, catalogs, cereal boxes, milk and juice cartons, juice boxes, paper-back books and cardboard.
- **Do** recycle glass jars and bottles free of food residue.
- **Do** recycle clean aluminum and bi-metal cans.
- **Do** recycle plastics 1-5 and 7. These include soda and juice bottles, milk jugs, six-pack drink "rings", shampoo bottles etc.
- **Do** rinse your bottles and containers. You can leave on the labels. Remove the caps.
- **Do** flatten all cardboard and cereal boxes.
- **Do** commingle all materials in the designated recycling containers. Our automated sorting system separates the material.

Don'ts

- **Don't** put contaminated paper in your recycling. Soiled items such as pizza boxes, napkins and tissues are not recyclable.
- **Don't** put plastics bags in your recycling. Plastics bags must be returned to your grocer.
- **Don't** place broken window or drinking glass, pottery or china in your recycling.
- **Don't** put Styrofoam, plastic take-out containers or packaging materials in your recycling.
- **Don't** place CFL bulbs in your recycling. Bring to your local Ace or Home Depot for processing.
- **Don't** use black bags.
- **Don't** put recycling in the trash receptacle. Place in designated recycling container.



Outdoor Fireplaces

The Northlake Municipal Code places certain restrictions on open burning and portable outdoor fireplaces in order to protect lives and property. The restrictions summarized below do not apply to outdoor fireplaces, charcoal grills, burners or similar devices when used solely for cooking food.

- Outdoor or portable fireplaces may be used only with approved fuel: propane, natural gas, charcoal or seasoned logs. It is illegal to burn yard waste, leaves, lumber, paper, cardboard, unseasoned logs or garbage.
- An outdoor or portable fireplace must be located and used at least 15 feet from any structure. The firebox must be located above ground level.
- The outdoor or portable fireplace must be constantly attended by a person over the age of 17 until the fire is extinguished. An adequate amount of sand, dirt or water, or a portable fire extinguisher with a minimum rating of 4-A must be on hand for immediate use.
- No outdoor or portable fireplace may be used in such a way as to emit offensive or objectionable smoke or odors, or when atmospheric conditions or other circumstances make such fires hazardous.

Observing these simple precautions will help keep you, your family and your neighbors safe and happy.

Uses for Mulch

There may be different types of mulch, but they all perform at least three basic functions: they reduce soil water losses, suppress weeds and protect against temperature extremes. In several studies, soil moisture percentages in areas that received mulch were twice as high, the temperatures of the soil were 8 to 13 degrees less and the amount of time required to remove weeds was reduced by two thirds.

It can be used as ground covering in a flower garden to prevent weeds. It protects the roots and bark of the trees when put around a tree base, and it can also be decorative, cover areas that may not grow anything because of shade.
