

City, Park District Work Together for Kahl Park Expansion

The City of Northlake recently completed a new comprehensive plan with the assistance of the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP). The prior comprehensive plan was done in 1994. Both plans noted the lack of open space within the City of Northlake. This does not come as a surprise as Northlake was developed in the 1940's and 1950's without the guidance of a comprehensive plan. While the City has made progress in this regard, we are still short of open space. The 2013 plan recommends 49 acres of open space. The City currently has 36 acres.

Since the City is fully developed, opportunities to create more open space are few and far between. New and creative ways need to be found to achieve this goal. The City and the local park districts have formed partnerships to create more recreational space. Friendship Park, south of North Avenue came about through a partnership between School District 87, Memorial Park District and the City of Northlake. Poshalla Park, on Whitehall came about through a partnership between the Veteran's Park

District, the City of Northlake and School District 87.

Recently, the City of Northlake and the Veteran's Park District have come together to expand Kahl Park, located between Palmer and Dickens Avenues. An opportunity to purchase a residence to the west of the park arose, and the city and the park district agreed to jointly purchase this property. The portion of McLean Avenue which separates the property from the park will be vacated as well, which will double the size of the addition to the park. Utilizing the existing street as part of the project gives us more bang for the buck, similar to a "2 for 1" purchase.

Work will begin in spring on the removal of the street and residence and the land will be incorporated into the existing Kahl Park, where the additional recreational space is needed.

I would like to thank the Veteran's Park District for their cooperation on this joint effort to improve recreational opportunities for our residents.

Northlake Baseball and Softball Going West

Northlake Baseball and softball is making a move to play against teams in the western suburbs. In a December meeting of the Western Suburban League, Northlake baseball was accepted unanimously to play baseball against the following towns: Bensenville, Wood Dale, Itasca, Glendale Heights, Villa Park and Addison. We will be attending meetings in January to try to move our softball program to the same areas in the 5 Star Softball League. The number one rule change is a new cut-off date for the age groups. The new cut-off date is July 31, not April 30. This new date follows the school calendar year and makes more sense than the "Little League" date. Softball does not change and remains January 1. Also, we will be starting the season later, hopefully, under better weather conditions. There is no mandate to end the season before the fourth of July. There are no league fees to be paid up front and the trophies for 1st and 2nd place will be shared equally by division. We will still play 16 games and each other twice. Disposing of Holiday Trees

Christmas trees will be picked up without a refuse sticker if placed at the curb on your regular garbage collection day during the first and second week in January. After that, a sticker is required. All ornaments, lights and nails must be removed. Trees may not be placed in plastic bags. Wrapping paper, packing peanuts, garlands and wreaths may be included with regular garbage. Boxes may be recycled if they measure no more than three feet by three feet and have been flattened.



Northlake Police Traffic Safety Division

The Northlake Police Department wishes to inform the community that there is new state law prohibiting the use of mobile telephones while operating a motor vehicle, effective January 1, 2014.

Cell phone use while driving is the number one distraction behind the wheel. Talking on a cell phone while driving makes you four times as likely to crash, and texting while driving increases your chances of a crash by up to eight to 23 times.

The use of mobile telephones is only allowed under the following circumstances:

- A driver using an electronic communication device for the sole purpose of reporting an emergency situation and continued communication with emergency personnel during the emergency situation.
- A law enforcement officer or operator of an emergency vehicle while performing his or her official duties.
- A driver using an electronic communication device in hands-free or voice-operated mode, which may include the use of a headset.
- A driver using an electronic communication device while parked on the shoulder of a roadway.
- A driver using an electronic communication device when the vehicle is stopped due to normal traffic being obstructed and the driver has the motor vehicle transmission in neutral or park.



Be a Good Neighbor

Residents are reminded to not blow or shovel snow onto the street when cleaning driveways or sidewalks. If you have a fire hydrant in front of or near your home, please be a good citizen and keep it free of ice and snow. It can be a matter of life or death for firefighters to be able to locate and get to the hydrants quickly in a fire emergency. If possible, please help elderly neighbors with their sidewalks and by clearing snow from school bus stops and school crossings.

Sump Pump Discharge

Residents whose sump pumps are not connected to the City storm sewers are reminded that sump pumps may not be allowed to discharge water onto City streets and sidewalks. This practice is illegal and creates hazardous conditions for both motorists and pedestrians.

Sky Lanterns are Illegal in Illinois

The Illinois Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) recently issued a notice officially banning the use, distribution and retail sale of sky lanterns in the State of Illinois. A number of other states have issued or are considering similar bans on these dangerous devices.

Sky lanterns, also known as floating lanterns or aerial luminaries, pose a serious risk for injuries, fires, and automobile accidents. The paper lantern contains a small candle or fuel cell that, when lit, heats the air in the lantern, causing it to rise into the air. Sky lanterns float wherever the wind takes them until the flame goes out, often traveling for long distances. There is no way to control their final destination, which may be in a wooded area, on a rooftop, or in the middle of a busy highway. They are still extremely hot when they land and have been known to start residential and forest fires. The Federal Aviation Association has also raised concerns regarding the possibility of sky lanterns being sucked into the engines of airborne aircraft.

Just Hang Up!

The Best Way to Avoid Telephone Scams Is Also the Easiest.

Every day, seniors throughout Illinois fall prey to smooth-talking con artists who call them up and tell all kinds of convincing stories to get their money.

The Office of the Illinois Attorney General wants you to know that it's shrewd, not rude, to hang up the phone when a stranger asks you to send them money or give out your personal information.

The following are some common warning signs of telephone scams. If you spot any of these signs while on the phone, don't think twice:

Just Hang Up!

THEY CONTACT YOU. When you look up the number of a reputable business on your own and call to place an order, you have a good idea who's on the other end of the deal. But when the tables are turned and someone calls you, you have no way of knowing who the person really is, where they're calling from, or what they want from you. **Just Hang Up!**

THEY WANT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION. Any time a stranger asks you for your bank account number, Social Security number, or other sensitive information, you should be on high alert. This is a sure sign of identity theft. **Never** give personal or financial information to someone you do not know. **Just Hang Up!**

THEY PROMISE A BIG AWARD. Scammers try to lure you in with promises of unexpected riches such as a large sum of money, a vacation, or a "get rich quick" investment scheme. Remember: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. **Just Hang Up!**

YOU MUST PAY THEM FIRST. It is illegal for someone to require an upfront payment to claim a lottery or sweepstakes prize. Scammers will often tell you that you must wire money out of state, or even out of the country, to obtain your winnings. **Never** wire money to a stranger. Wiring money is just like sending cash—scammers will get the money quickly, and you won't get it back. **Just Hang Up!**

Consider placing your phone number on the **National Do Not Call Registry**, if you haven't already done so. This will block most unwanted telemarketing calls. So, once your number is on the registry, you'll know that any telemarketer who does call you is probably up to no good. You can register your home phone or cell phone online at www.donotcall.gov or by calling 1-888-382-1222 (TTY: 1-866-290-4236) from the phone number you wish to register.





Northlake Police Department Receives CALEA Re-accreditation Award

Chief Dennis Koletsos and the members of the Northlake Police Department are proud to announce the department's award of Advanced Re-accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The November 16, 2013 award was received at the Commission's National Conference in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. This prestigious award is granted to applicant law enforcement agencies that have proven, through policy and practice, that they have met or exceeded national standards recognized by the commission, which reflect excellence in policing as well as adherence to modern management concepts. The process consists of both an offsite and onsite assessment of agency policy and practices by a CALEA Assessment Team, and a hearing before CALEA Commissioners at their National Conference.

Northlake Police Department is proud to be amongst a small number of agencies throughout Illinois and the United States who have earned the Advanced Accreditation Award. Such an award is a credit to the agency, City officials, residents and the business community. The Northlake Police Department is committed to providing the highest level of police services available to the community and look forward to proving such acclaim through future accreditation processes.

Snow Removal

Snow Removal is vital to safe driving. Main roads are always cleared first, followed by side streets and less traveled roadways. It is inevitable that some snow will be pushed onto driveway approaches during the process. Here are some things residents can do to help during a snow storm.

- Wait until the street is cleared before removing snow from driveway approaches.
- Do not park on city streets for eight hours following a snowfall of two inches or more.
- Do not blow or shovel snow onto the street when clearing sidewalks and driveways.
- If you have a fire hydrant in front of your home, keep it free of ice and snow so that firefighters can locate and get to it quickly in a fire emergency.
- Be a good neighbor by helping elderly neighbors with snow removal and by keeping school bus stops and school crossings clear.

Driving In Snowy or Icy Conditions

The best way to avoid problems in icy weather is to not drive at all. However, if you can't avoid it, try to wait until the City plows and/or salts the streets. Slow down and allow plenty of extra room between you and the car in front of you. Apply the brakes gently to avoid skidding and ease off the brake if the wheels start to lock. Be especially careful on bridges, overpasses and less traveled roads. Also, make sure your car is in good working condition by checking the following:

- Make sure headlights, tail lights and brake lights are clean and in working condition.
- Check wiper blades and make sure you have plenty of fluid.
- Test your battery to avoid being stranded in the cold.
- Check the tread and tire pressure on your tires.
- Be sure you have plenty of antifreeze.
- Make sure your brakes are in good condition.
- Never let your car run low on fuel during the winter months. Keep equipment in the car that you may need: jumper cables, shovel, bag of salt or cat litter, a working flashlight and extra batteries, an ice scraper and snow brush and extra windshield wiper fluid.
- Also have warm clothing and blankets, especially if you travel long distances.
- Make sure your cell phone is with you and is charged.

Beat The Cold

Winter officially began on December 21, though the cold and snow started much earlier. The cold weather can cause health and safety problems if you are not prepared. The following tips are common sense solutions to some of winter's potential problems.

- Wear layers of warm, dry clothing including hat and gloves. Wet clothing takes away the insulating effect.
- Cover exposed skin surfaces as protection from frostbite (numbness, red nose, chin, fingers, forehead, stiff cheeks) warm gradually by wrapping or placing next to warm skin. Do not rub affected areas.
- Be aware of hypothermia (body temperature 95°F or less). Stiff muscles, puffy face, slowed breathing, poor physical condition, mental confusion. If these signs are recognized, call 911 immediately.
- Drink non-alcoholic beverages such as tea, coffee, hot chocolate and soup.
- Maintain good nutrition and get plenty of rest.
- Prescription drugs may increase vulnerability to cold. Check with your pharmacist or doctor.
- Be aware of elderly and disabled persons living alone. Offer assistance.
- It is dangerous to use an oven as a heating device. All space heaters are a fire risk if used improperly.
- Individuals 65 and older should obtain a flu shot every year.

Trees Available for 2014 Spring Planting Season

Trees for the 2014 spring planting season are available. As a matter of fact, you can make a request for a tree to be planted during any time in the next 5 years. If you have room on your parkway to provide a home for a tree, call Public Works at 708-562-0940 to pick from the list of trees for planting.

Remember, trees located on the parkway or in the City's right of way cannot be cut or trimmed without permission from the City. The right of way is generally the area 20 feet from the back of the curb. If in doubt, or if a tree in this area needs attention, call Public Works at 708-562-0940.

Solicitors Warning

The City of Northlake, the Northlake Police Department and the Northlake Fire Department are NOT asking for donations from residents of Northlake. If you receive a phone call, or someone solicits door to door, before you donate, call City Hall to see if anyone who requests funds is registered with the Clerk's Office.

Reminder About Tents

Tents, defined as any portable structure, including sunscreens, with or without walls, made of canvas or other like materials, need to be dismantled from the front yard between Memorial Day and Labor Day. These structures need to be dismantled from areas other than the front yard between November 1 and April 1. This ordinance, O-16-2002, includes poles, stakes, wires and ropes.

Wipers and Lights

Motorists are reminded that Illinois Vehicle Code 12-201(b) requires the use of headlights, not only from sunset to sunrise, but also any time snow, rain, ice, for or other weather conditions require the use of windshield wipers. Headlights must also be used any time a person or vehicle on the highway is not clearly visible at a distance of 1,000 feet.

Placing Trash at Curb

Residents are reminded that trash may not be placed on the parkway before 5 p.m. the evening before the scheduled pick-up, which is Friday morning, unless there is a holiday during the week, when pick up will be on Saturday. Containers must be removed from the parkway by 5:00 p.m.

Inoperable Vehicles Prohibited

Northlake Municipal Code prohibits storing or parking junk cars or inoperable vehicles in residential districts. This regulation applies to any unlicensed vehicles or those with flat tires, broken windshields or other conditions that make them inoperable.

Senior and Physically Disabled Citizen Subsidized Taxi Program

About the program...

The Senior Citizen and Disabled Subsidized Taxi Program is a service of Leyden Township that responds to the transportation needs of adults 60 years of age and older, or the physically disabled who reside in Leyden Township and have no access to other forms of transportation. The program is designed to allow seniors and the physically disabled to attend doctor and hospital appointments and to allow them to go grocery shopping and other life sustaining activities.

Where to apply...

Taxi coupon books can be purchased once a month at the Leyden Town Hall located at 2501 North Mannheim Road, Franklin Park, Monday through Friday, 9:00am to 5:00pm, or the satellite office located at 2 Conti Parkway, Elmwood Park, Tuesday and Friday, 10:00am to 4:00pm. Applications for the program are also available at these locations.

How the program works...

Coupon books cost \$10.00 and have a value of \$20.00. A coupon (\$2.00 in value) is used as cash toward taxi fare. Individuals are allowed to purchase one book per month. Each book has an expiration date and must be used on or before that date. **No refunds or exchanges are available.** All coupons must be used with cab companies contracted by Leyden Township. These companies and phone numbers are listed on the back of the coupon books.

Taxi Hints:

1. Avoid calling taxi companies during rush hours, as waiting time will be longer than normal.
2. If you have a change of plans please call the Taxi Company and cancel your request. Companies and drivers appreciate this courtesy.
3. Tipping is at the expense and discretion of the rider.
4. Taxis are in great demand in bad weather. Plan ahead and be patient if cab service is slow.
5. If you would like a courtesy call if cabs are running late, please make sure you leave your phone number for the Taxi Company to contact you.
6. When calling for taxi service, inform the Taxi Company that you are paying with Leyden Township cab coupons.



We provide free rides to: Target, Wal-Mart, Beauty/Barber Shops, Senior Clubs, Post Office, Banks, Grocery Stores, North Riverside Mall, (Oakbrook and Yorktown Malls are on Mondays ONLY)

Ride reservations can be made for Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 2:30 p.m., (except holidays and when the Township offices are closed).

Due to traffic inconsistencies, clients are required to be ready 15-minutes prior to their scheduled pick-up time and to watch for the Township car. The driver will stop at the designated address and wait briefly (5-minutes), if there is no response, the driver will leave. Our drivers are not allowed to go inside a client's home.

Scheduling Procedures:

- Call (708/344-8801) for reservations. Multiple stops are not allowed.
- You must call by 12:00 noon, the previous day, to reserve your appointment.
- If you are going shopping, you are allowed no more than two (2) packages.
- The rider cannot reserve travel to one location and change it with the driver.
- Each rider can have one (1) round trip per day - two (2) times per week.
- Free car transportation is provided for Proviso Township residents who are:
 - 60 years of age and older
 - Mentally challenged, who can't operate a motorized vehicle

Due to Insurance Regulations:

- Individuals, who are not physically and/or mentally able to get from their house to the car and destination by themselves, will not be transported unless accompanied by another individual who can assist them.
- Smoking is prohibited in all Township cars.
- Passengers **MUST** wear **seatbelts, at all times**, in Township vehicles; **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Those who cannot will forfeit their free ride.

When I was elected, I made a pledge to be accessible to my constituents, and that's something I try to live up to every day. Whether it's through our citizens' advisory committees, town hall meetings, open forums, or by talking to constituents at their doorstep or on the phone, I try to be as accessible as possible. And now, I am asking for your feedback.



With the Spring legislative session beginning in January, it's the time of year when I can submit ideas to be drafted into bills. Last year, some of my bills were aimed at reducing crime, lowering the tax burden on working families, and banning electronic cigarettes for minors. City regulation states that there will be no parking on all streets between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m.

Also, on north-south streets, there is no parking on the west side of the street at any time. On east-west streets, there is no parking on the north side of the street at any time.

Ten Uses for a Pencil Eraser

1. Handle heavy pictures like a pro: To keep scuff marks off your wall from a picture frame, pull out the erasers from two pencils and glue them to the bottom corners of the picture frame. The soft rubber will act as a cushion to keep the frame from grazing the surface of the wall. Plus the eraser will grip the wall and keep it from moving around.
2. Get crystal clear land line reception from your cordless phone. Gently rub a pencil eraser over the metal squares on the bottom of the handset and the charger. The soft rubber will swiftly clear dust buildup that can interrupt the flow of electricity between the metal contacts. The result will be an excellent call with no interference.
3. Remove scuff marks in seconds. Scuff marks on the floor can be difficult to remove. Gently rub them with a pencil eraser. Mineral pumice, which will create abrasive action, is found in erasers. Just wipe the area with a damp cloth afterward to remove any remaining eraser residue.
4. Plant seeds in half the time. Using the eraser end of a pencil, insert gently into the soil about an inch. Then drop a seed into the depression. This minimizes mess and helps keep fingernails clean.
5. Keep kids entertained for hours. Make polka dot pictures. Set up a few pots or plastic cups with different color paints. Dip the eraser side into a color and dab it onto paper. The children can create imaginative pictures with dots.
6. Life an ink stain from suede. Gently rub the ink stain with a pencil eraser in the direction of the suede's grain. The eraser will form crumb-like particles that'll get under the surface of the suede and lift the ground-in mark.
7. Make sure an earring stays secure. If the back of your earring has fallen off and you're not at home to replace it, use an eraser. Gently push it into the stud's post. It will hold until you can find a replacement.
8. Rub away computer keyboard grime. If you are reluctant to use a liquid cleaner on your keyboard, rub a pencil eraser across the keys and in the spaces between them. The eraser's abrasives will dislodge stuck on particles. Just give the keys a blast with the hair dryer, set on cool, to get rid of any debris.
9. Fix a scratched LCD TV screen. To remove a scratch from your TV screen, just gently rub the eraser down the length of the scratch. The eraser will create friction, causing the screen's liquid crystals to heat up and become slightly malleable. The soft rubber will work to smooth jagged edges, making the mark disappear.
10. Polish jewelry in a pinch. If some of your old jewelry is looking dingy, just rub a pencil eraser over the dull pieces a few times. The tool's tiny rubber particles will absorb the oil and grime and buff away fingerprint smudges, leaving the accessories sparkling in no time.

Senior Swindles: Beware of these Come-Ons

Twenty percent of American's over the age of 65 have been victimized by financial scams. Some people, frustrated by low CD rates are getting reeled in by schemes promising high returns. Others listen to telemarketers and direct mail solicitations. Never give out your social security number over the phone. No legitimate company will ask you for this information. Hang up immediately if asked. You should really pay attention and watch for one of the following common scams.

1. Free seminar lunch: They get you into their facility by offering a free lunch and then convince you to sign up for "low risk" investments that only enrich the person who is the seminar leader.
2. "Help me grandma!" Someone phones to claim that they are your grandchild and in need of money after an accident or an arrest. Ask a question only he or she could answer, like his high school name or the name of one of his brothers or sisters. Sometimes someone calls claiming to be a lawyer, police officer or parole officer and they say your grandchild is in trouble, in the hospital or in jail and asks for money to be wired.
3. Take a trip on us: These are often phone or mail pitches for very pricey time-shares.
4. You're a winner: But first you have to send them money to collect. They say these are taxes or fees. Never pay money up front to collect money you have legitimately won.
5. Medicare spoof: A caller claims to be a Medicare representative and asks for bank account information to activate new federal benefits. Often the call seems legitimate because spoofers can falsify the number that appears on the caller id. Medicare will not call you to ask for any bank information or social security numbers.
6. Magazine scams: Door to door salesmen falsely say they are raising money for local sports teams by selling magazines that will be sent to troops in Iraq.
7. Credit card interest rate: Con artists say they can help lower credit interest rate, but they are actually trying to get credit account information to use your card.
8. Jury duty scam: Caller claims that you missed jury duty. When you say you never received a jury summons, they ask for your social security number and birth date so they can "verify the information and cancel the arrest warrant."
9. Counterfeit check scam: You receive a real-looking fake check with a letter explaining you have won a lottery or sweepstakes. You are instructed to deposit the check and wire back a specified amount of money to cover the taxes on the winnings. Often it takes the bank several days to verify that the check is fake. By that time, your money is gone.
10. Never hire someone to do unsolicited work in or around your home. Reputable contractors don't sell their services door-to-door. If someone comes to your door claiming to be a contractor or City worker, ask for identification. Don't leave the house with them so they can show you something in your back yard. If they refuse to leave, call 9-1-1.

Trust your instincts. If it doesn't feel real, it probably isn't. If though you find yourself becoming a victim, you can complain to the Consumer fraud hot line at 800-388-5438, or the Senior Fraud Hotline at 899-243-5377.




