





## Funding Police Pension Just One of the Challenges fo City's Finances

Last year, the amount required to fund the City of Northlake Police pension Fund was \$889,921. The funding forecast provided by the actuary sets this figure at \$1,005,094 for 2014; an increase of \$115,173.00.

We cannot keep adding these amounts to the City's real estate tax levy. Although the City's portion of your tax bill is only 12% of the total, any increase still contributes to the total paid by property owners.

The City cannot reduce pension benefits as an alternative, as these have been set by the State Legislature over the years, and local municipalities have no control over the terms of the pension. The Legislature sets the pension benefits, leaving the issue of funding to local governments.

In addition to increased pension costs, the City is also facing increases for insurance coverage, partly due to the "Affordable Health Care Act," utility bills, fuel costs, as well as trying to maintain and improve our infrastructure and facilities.

New revenue sources are few and far between. In October, the City Council took up the matter of video gaming, as the City would receive 5% of the revenue from this activity. It appears likely that video gaming will be approved by the City Council before the end of the year, with the provision that all proceeds be paid to the police pension fund. Hopefully this will keep future increases in the City's contribution to the fund from appearing on your tax bill.

Overall, the City's financial picture is relatively solid. However, we must take steps to make sure that going into the future, we maintain fiscal stability, and meet our obligations without placing an undue burden on City taxpayers. We will continue to find ways to streamline procedures and practices while maintaining City services as well as providing a solid base for the future.

## Stryker Soccer Wraps Up Outdoor Season

Centerpoint Preserve was host to its first soccer league in four years. In a joint venture between Northlake and Stone Park, the sport of youth soccer was a wonderful success. In November of 2012, four representatives from each town met and formed a formal not for profit organization to start summer soccer in Northlake. Although we had several registrations, the teams were not finalized until early May. We learned that we had to wait until the local indoor soccer leagues were completed. Nevertheless, we had 62 teams with over 800 players competing in 5 age groups: U6, U8, U10, U12 and U14. All the games were held on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. We had no rain outs and the 3 weeks of playoffs ended on September 14th. The first place teams received a giant trophy (not as big as the Stanley Cup) and medals were awarded to both first and second place players. The Stryker Soccer Board members would like to thank Mayor Sherwin, Mayor Mazzulla, Dale Roberts (Northlake Public Works) and Bill Otte (Veterans Park District) for all their help and cooperation. The City of Northlake offers snow removal services to property owners who are disabled, handicapped and/or have severe health problems and have no one else who is able to help them with snow removal. Those interested in snow removal must re-apply every year. Deadline is November 8<sup>th</sup>. No exceptions. Be sure to turn in your completed application and doctor verification to City Hall before November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2013. New applicants must submit medical verification from a doctor to City hall in order to be eligible. Billing is \$10 per removal.

**Remember: The snow plow will make one pass only on your drive way.**





## Just Hang Up!

The Best Way to Avoid Telephone Scams Is Also the Easiest.

Every day, seniors throughout Illinois fall prey to smooth-talking con artists who call them up and tell all kinds of convincing stories to get their money.


The Office of the Illinois Attorney General wants you to know that it's shrewd, not rude, to hang up the phone when a stranger asks you to send them money or give out your personal information.

The following are some common warning signs of telephone scams. If you spot any of these signs while on the phone, don't think twice:

### Just Hang Up!

**THEY CONTACT YOU.** When you look up the number of a reputable business on your own and call to place an order, you have a good idea who's on the other end of the deal. But when the tables are turned and someone calls you, you have no way of knowing who the person really is, where they're calling from, or what they want from you. *Just Hang Up!*

**THEY WANT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION.** Any time a stranger asks you for your bank account number, Social Security number, or other sensitive information, you should be on high alert. This is a sure sign of identity theft. *Never* give personal or financial information to someone you do not know. *Just Hang Up!*



### Just Hang Up!

**THEY PROMISE A BIG AWARD.** Scammers try to lure you in with promises of unexpected riches such as a large sum of money, a vacation, or a "get rich quick" investment scheme. Remember: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. *Just Hang Up!*

**YOU MUST PAY THEM FIRST.** It is illegal for someone to require an upfront payment to claim a lottery or sweepstakes prize. Scammers will often tell you that you must wire money out of state, or even out of the country, to obtain your winnings. *Never* wire money to a stranger. Wiring money is just like sending cash—scammers will get the money quickly, and you won't get it back. *Just Hang Up!*

Consider placing your phone number on the **National Do Not Call Registry**, if you haven't already done so. This will block most unwanted telemarketing calls. So, once your number is on the registry, you'll know that any telemarketer who does call you is probably up to no good. You can register your home phone or cell phone online at [www.donotcall.gov](http://www.donotcall.gov) or by calling 1-888-382-1222 (TTY: 1-866-290-4236) from the phone number you wish to register.

## The 411 on Recycling

The new recycling carts delivered last year to replace the smaller recycling bins have been a success. Many people have commented that the community looks neater and cleaner.

To keep Northlake's recycling program on a successful track, we are asking that you your part. Household waste should never be placed in the recycling carts. Doing so contaminates recyclable materials and the recycling cart will not be emptied.

The system works best when everyone does it correctly. Here are a few reminders about the recycling program:

- Use only the recycling carts that have been provided. However, additional recyclables that do not fit in your cart can be collected in another recycling bin or paper bag.
- All containers to be recycled should be rinsed and free of food, caps and lids
- Broken down cardboard boxes can be placed next to the cart
- DO NOT be use recycling carts for any other type of refuse

Below is a list of items that can be recycled in the Northlake program. Many items that are not accepted may be recycled by other means. Contact city hall at 847-343-8700 for more information.

## What Can Be Recycled

- Newspaper
- Mixed Paper: advertisements, direct mail, office paper, stationery, envelopes, paper bags, gift wrap
- Magazines, catalogs and telephone books
- Cardboard and boxboard
- Soda and beer carrying cases
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminum cans and foil
- Tin and steel cans, including empty aerosol cans
- Plastic bottles and containers coded #1- #7 (except #6)
- Six or twelve pack rings
- Milk and juice cartons

## What Cannot Be Recycled

- Soiled items such as pizza boxes, napkins and tissues
- Plastic take-out containers, cups, plates, or utensils
- Plastic bags and film
- Styrofoam or packing peanuts
- Disposable diapers or rags
- Needles or syringes
- Mirror and window glass, compact fluorescent and other light bulbs
- Electronic items
- Printer or toner cartridges
- Toys and ceramics
- Motor oil, insecticide and hazardous chemical containers

Electronic items can be dropped off at the Public Works Building, 100 W. Palmer, Monday through Friday, 7:30 to 3:00 p.m.

## Message from 77th District State Representative Kathleen Willis

November is a month that sees many families beginning to prepare for the holidays. The leaves have changed and the air has cooled and many of us are trying to get a head-start on our holiday shopping.

Yet we must remember that November is an important month for giving thanks. This month we celebrate both Thanksgiving and Veterans' Day. These two holidays are very important as they remind us of all that we have and the sacrifices made by others to ensure we keep what we have.

Many of us know the story of the first Thanksgiving. We have images of Pilgrims and Native Americans gathering around a turkey in anticipation of a grand feast. However many may not know that Thanksgiving was not declared a national holiday until 1863. It was in the midst of the Civil War that President Abraham Lincoln declared Thanksgiving a national holiday as he asked that citizens not only give thanks on this day, but also "care [for] all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged."

We see that Lincoln fully intended Thanksgiving to be not only a time of thanks, but also a time of support for those who have sacrificed their lives or have been harshly impacted in the preservation and service to our country. It seems very fitting that both Thanksgiving and Veterans' Day are celebrated in November.

Therefore, I have started, in partnership with Cell Phones for Soldiers to collect 50,000 old and unused cell phones this year. Proceeds will be used to purchase calling cards for our service men and women so they can stay connected to home. There are 150,000 troops serving overseas. ## Uses for Mulch

There may be different types of mulch, but they all perform at least three basic functions: they reduce soil water losses, suppress weeds and protect against temperature extremes. In several studies, soil moisture percentages in areas that received mulch were twice as high, the temperatures of the soil were 8 to 13 degrees less and the amount of time required to remove weeds was reduced by two thirds.

It can be used as ground covering in a flower garden to prevent weeds. It protects the roots and bark of the trees when put around a tree base, and it can also be decorative, cover areas that may not grow anything because of shade.



## City Bus Program to End – Alternative Programs Will Offer Better Services

As you may be aware, the City of Northlake has been operating a “Dial a Ride” bus service for well over 20 years. While the program has been successful, ridership has been steadily declining over the years. All City programs need to be evaluated and adjusted on a regular basis and the City’s bus program is no exception. Since the vehicles have reached the end of their service life, it was a good opportunity to examine this program.

The Pace Dial a Ride Program serving Leyden Township (the area of Northlake north of North Avenue) provides a larger service area than the Northlake bus covered. Service is provided anywhere within Leyden Township, as well as Harlem-Irving Shopping Center, Loyola Hospital, Hines Hospital, the dialysis center in Norridge and Westlake Hospital.

Proviso Township also offers transportation to a larger area than did the Northlake bus.

In addition to these services, Leyden Township also offers a discounted taxi program for seniors and handicapped individuals. We are working with Leyden Township to make this program available to all of Northlake through an intergovernmental agreement.

In view of these alternative transportation programs available to Northlake residents, it is financially prudent to use city resources in other areas rather than providing duplicate services. The City bus program will end on December 31, 2013. The City will be saving the cost of fuel, replacement vehicles and the salary of the bus driver (who will be transferred to Public Works to fill a vacancy). This amounts to over \$100,000 per year in savings.

In addition, the increased participation from Northlake residents will strengthen the other transportation programs as well.

### Senior and Physically Disabled Citizen Subsidized Taxi Program

#### About the program...

The Senior Citizen and Disabled Subsidized Taxi Program is a service of Leyden Township that responds to the transportation needs of adults 60 years of age and older, or the physically disabled who reside in Leyden Township and have no access to other forms of transportation. The program is designed to allow seniors and the physically disabled to attend doctor and hospital appointments and to allow them to go grocery shopping and other life sustaining activities.

#### Where to apply...

Taxi coupon books can be purchased once a month at the Leyden Town Hall located at 2501 North Mannheim Road, Franklin Park, Monday through Friday, 9:00am to 5:00pm, or the satellite office located at 2 Conti Parkway, Elmwood Park, Tuesday and Friday, 10:00am to 4:00pm. Applications for the program are also available at these locations.

#### How the program works...

Coupon books cost \$10.00 and have a value of \$20.00. A coupon (\$2.00 in value) is used as cash toward taxi fare. Individuals are allowed to purchase one book per month. Each book has an expiration date and must be used on or before that date.

**No refunds or exchanges are available.** All coupons must be used with cab companies contracted by Leyden Township. These companies and phone numbers are listed on the back of the coupon books.

#### Taxi Hints:

1. Avoid calling taxi companies during rush hours, as waiting time will be longer than normal.
2. If you have a change of plans please call the Taxi Company and cancel your request. Companies and drivers appreciate this courtesy.
3. Tipping is at the expense and discretion of the rider.
4. Taxis are in great demand in bad weather. Plan ahead and be patient if cab service is slow.
