



LED Street Lighting Program Moves from Test Stage

Several years ago, the City of Northlake installed LED lighting on one block of Armitage Avenue as a test and demonstration project.

Last year, all of the City's lighting systems in the parks and along Midland Trail were converted to LED lighting. The City's experience, along with other municipalities' experiences with LED street lighting has been extremely positive and the decision was made to expand the program to the rest of the street light systems operated by the City of Northlake.

Northlake has two street lighting systems – one is operated and maintained by ComEd. These lights are the ones on the wooden poles. The City owned and maintained lights are the ones on the metal poles.

New LED lights will be installed on Fullerton Avenue east of Wolf Road, the rest

of Armitage Avenue and South Roy Avenue. The approximate cost for this work is \$66,000. However, the City has obtained grant funding in the amount of \$35,000 to defray the cost of the work. The balance of the funding will be made up to the City with reduced energy and maintenance costs going forward. LED bulbs are designed to operate for approximately 12 years and consume less energy than the sodium vapor bulbs they are replacing. The City's goal is to convert all City owned street lighting to LED. ComEd has made no announcement as to whether they will be converting their lighting system to LED.

In any event, the City will be saving money on energy costs and maintenance going forward and less energy being consumed will benefit the environment and reliable, durable lighting will enhance public safety as well.

February is National Spay/Neuter Month

The Department of Animal & Rabies Control will be offering a rebate of for spay/neuter costs in the month of February.

The Cook County Department of Animal & Rabies Control are doing their part to help solve our country's pet overpopulation problem. Cook County residents can have their dogs, cats, or ferrets spayed/neutered during the month of February and save \$40 through their veterinarian.

How the rebate program works:

1. Call your veterinarian to ask if she/he is participating in the Cook County spay/neuter rebate program.
2. Schedule an appointment in February with a participating veterinarian.
3. Bring your cat, dog or ferret in for spay/neuter surgery. Limit is two pets per household.
4. Pay your veterinarian for the surgery, minus the \$40 rebate
5. Veterinarians receive a \$40 rebate for each spay/neuter performed during the month of February.
6. All pets must either receive a rabies vaccination and tag the day of surgery or have a current rabies vaccination and tag to qualify for the program.





Northlake Police Traffic and Safety Division Parking & Traffic Regulations


The Northlake Police Department Traffic Division would like to remind the community of several parking and traffic regulations that would assist you in your travels and parking in the City of Northlake.

- The speed limit in residential areas is 20mph unless otherwise posted. The speed limit in all alleys is 10mph.
- Parking is not allowed on city streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., unless granted permission by the Northlake Police Department.
- Vehicles are not allowed to park blocking the sidewalks or driveways. It is also against City Ordinance to park vehicles on the lawn.
- It is unlawful to park any vehicles on any city street after a two (2) inch snowfall and before the street is cleared of snow.
- All vehicles that are registered in the City of Northlake must have a valid City sticker. City stickers are available at City Hall at no cost to the residents.

Just Hang Up!

The Best Way to Avoid Telephone Scams Is Also the Easiest.

Every day, seniors throughout Illinois fall prey to smooth-talking con artists who call them up and tell all kinds of convincing stories to get their money.

The Office of the Illinois Attorney General wants you to know that it's shrewd, not rude, to hang up the phone when a stranger asks you to send them money or give out your personal information.

The following are some common warning signs of telephone scams. If you spot any of these signs while on the phone, don't think twice:

Just Hang Up!

THEY CONTACT YOU. When you look up the number of a reputable business on your own and call to place an order, you have a good idea who's on the other end of the deal. But when the tables are turned and someone calls you, you have no way of knowing who the person really is, where they're calling from, or what they want from you. **Just Hang Up!**

THEY WANT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION. Any time a stranger asks you for your bank account number, Social Security number, or other sensitive information, you should be on high alert. This is a sure sign of identity theft. **Never** give personal or financial information to someone you do not know. **Just Hang Up!**



Just Hang Up!

THEY PROMISE A BIG AWARD. Scammers try to lure you in with promises of unexpected riches such as a large sum of money, a vacation, or a "get rich quick" investment scheme. Remember: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. **Just Hang Up!**

YOU MUST PAY THEM FIRST. It is illegal for someone to require an upfront payment to claim a lottery or sweepstakes prize. Scammers will often tell you that you must wire money out of state, or even out of the country, to obtain your winnings. **Never** wire money to a stranger. Wiring money is just like sending cash—scammers will get the money quickly, and you won't get it back. **Just Hang Up!**

Consider placing your phone number on the **National Do Not Call Registry**, if you haven't already done so. This will block most unwanted telemarketing calls. So, once your number is on the registry, you'll know that any telemarketer who does call you is probably up to no good. You can register your home phone or cell phone online at www.donotcall.gov or by calling 1-888-382-1222 (TTY: 1-866-290-4236) from the phone number you wish to register.

Other Uses For Nail Polish Remover

1. Clean a keyboard: Moisten a cotton swab and gently dab laptop keys to restore them to their original condition.
2. Restore floors: Pour onto a paper towel and wipe away unsightly shoe marks on tile, laminate and concrete floors.
3. Rejuvenate stained china: soak an old cloth, than dab coffee or tea stained areas. Rinse with soap and water. Avoid decorative patterns, which could be ruined.
4. Shine shoes: saturate a paper towel, and wipe footwear until any scuffs or stains disappear. Use a damp cloth to remove leftover residue.
5. Erase super glue: to dissolve heavy duty adhesive from skin, soak a cotton swab and rub it onto the sticky area.
6. Revive a watch: To remove cuts and dings from a plastic watch cover, use a cotton swab to gently rub the surface. Because acetone can dissolve plastic, it will level and smooth the surface. But don't scrub too hard, or you could wind up making a hole in the plastic.
7. Make marker disappear: To remove the toughest of permanent ink stains on hands or walls, drench a cotton ball and then blot the stain away.
8. Clean razors: Acetone is a disinfectant, so dunk a razor to sanitize it, then rinse off gunk between the blades as well to make them last as long as possible.

Eliminate bathtub ring: to rid a tub or shower of soap and scum stains, dilute the polish remover with a little bit of water, and use a stiff brush to quickly scrub away residue.

Reminder About Tents

Tents, defined as any portable structure, including sunscreens, with or without walls, made of canvas or other like materials, need to be dismantled from the front yard between Memorial Day and Labor Day. These structures need to be dismantled from areas other than the front yard between November 1 and April 1. This ordinance, O-16-2002, includes poles, stakes, wires and ropes.

Wipers and Lights

Motorists are reminded that Illinois Vehicle Code 12-201(b) requires the use of headlights, not only from sunset to sunrise, but also any time snow, rain, ice, for or other weather conditions require the use of windshield wipers. Headlights must also be used any time a person or vehicle on the highway is not clearly visible at a distance of 1,000 feet.

Placing Trash at Curb

Residents are reminded that trash may not be placed on the parkway before 5 p.m. the evening before the scheduled pick-up, which is Friday morning, unless there is a holiday during the week, when pick up will be on Saturday. Containers must be removed from the parkway by 5:00 p.m.

About the program...

The Senior Citizen and Disabled Subsidized Taxi Program is a service of Leyden Township that responds to the transportation needs of adults 60 years of age and older, or the physically disabled who reside in Leyden Township and have no access to other forms of transportation. The program is designed to allow seniors and the physically disabled to attend doctor and hospital appointments and to allow them to go grocery shopping and other life sustaining activities.

Where to apply...

Taxi coupon books can be purchased once a month at the Leyden Town Hall located at 2501 North Mannheim Road, Franklin Park, Monday through Friday, 9:00am to 5:00pm, or the satellite office located at 2 Conti Parkway, Elmwood Park, Tuesday and Friday, 10:00am to 4:00pm. Applications for the program are also available at these locations.

How the program works...

Coupon books cost \$10.00 and have a value of \$20.00. A coupon (\$2.00 in value) is used as cash toward taxi fare. Individuals are allowed to purchase one book per month. Each book has an expiration date and must be used on or before that date. **No refunds or exchanges are available.** All coupons must be used with cab companies contracted by Leyden Township. These companies and phone numbers are listed on the back of the coupon books.

Taxi Hints:

1. Avoid calling taxi companies during rush hours, as waiting time will be longer than normal.
2. If you have a change of plans please call the Taxi Company and cancel your request. Companies and drivers appreciate this courtesy.
3. Tipping is at the expense and discretion of the rider.
4. Taxis are in great demand in bad weather. Plan ahead and be patient if cab service is slow.
5. If you would like a courtesy call if cabs are running late, please make sure you leave your phone number for the Taxi Company to contact you.
