Public Works Department Gets New Sewer Vactor

The Public Works Department took delivery of a new sewer vactor in March. The new machine replaces the 1991 vactor which was purchased used from the Village of St. Charles in 2001.



The new vactor has many improvements over the old machine including increased capacity and digital technology. The vactor is not only used for clearing residential sewers, but also clearing sewer mains, man holes and hydro excavating. This is important when digging in areas where multiple utilities are located, especially fiber optic cables.

Traditional digging methods would not be practical in these areas.

The new vactor costs \$384,758. The City borrowed \$344,758 on a short term loan which will be paid off in three years or less. The life span of the new vactor is estimated to be 25+ years, so this is a long term investment for the City. The cost of the machine spread over 25 years comes to approximately \$15,400 per year. The vactor is used weekly, sometimes over several days, so the cost of renting a comparable piece of equipment would exceed the amortized cost of \$15,400 per year.

Solicitors Warning

The City of Northlake, the Northlake Police Department and the Northlake Fire Department are NOT asking for donations from residents of Northlake. If you receive a phone call, or someone solicits door to door, before you donate, call City Hall to see if anyone who requests funds is registered with the Clerk's Office.

Reminder About Tents

Tents, defined as any portable structure, including sunscreens, with or without walls, made of canvas or other like materials, need to be dismantled from the front yard between Memorial Day and Labor Day. These structures need to be dismantled from areas other than the front yard between November 1 and April 1. This ordinance, O-16-2002, includes poles, stakes, wires and ropes.

Wipers and Lights

Motorists are reminded that Illinois Vehicle Code 12-201(b) requires the use of headlights, not only from sunset to sunrise, but also any time snow, rain, ice, for or other weather conditions require the use of windshield wipers. Headlights must also be used any time a person or vehicle on the highway is not clearly visible at a distance of 1,000 feet.

Placing Trash at Curb


Residents are reminded that trash may not be placed on the parkway before 5 p.m. the evening before the scheduled pick-up, which is Friday morning, unless there is a holiday during the week, when pick up will be on Saturday. Containers must be removed from the parkway by 5:00 p.m.

Inoperable Vehicles Prohibited

Northlake Municipal Code prohibits storing or parking junk cars or inoperable vehicles in residential districts. This regulation applies to any unlicensed vehicles or those with flat tires, broken windshields or other conditions that make them inoperable.

AUTOMATIC BILL PAYMENT SYSTEM







Brody Roybal, Along with Team USA, Take the Gold

On Saturday, he won a gold medal in Sled Hockey at the Paralympics. On Sunday, he was part of the closing ceremonies at the Sochi Olympics. On Monday, he flew home from Russia and returned to an overjoyed crowd and on Tuesday, he went back to his high school classes.

Brody Roybal, a team member on the sled Hockey Team in the Paralympics returned home Monday to approximately 200 people waiting outside his Northlake home to welcome and celebrate with him for a job well done. Brody said he was a little overwhelmed by the crowd. "I didn't imagine there would be that many people for just me."

During the course of the Olympics, Brody scored 2 goals against Italy, They ultimately won that game. The final game against Russia was won by one goal. The final score: 1 - 0. When he realized they had won, he thought it was "pretty awesome".

Brody said that they were aware of what was happening in the Ukraine during their time in Russia, but they weren't worrying about. They were there to play hockey. They never had a chance to meet Vladimir Putin, but they saw him watching the games.

When asked if he would like to return to the Olympics in four years, he said he hopes to return for the next five.

The oldest player on his team was 35, so he hopes to meet that goal.
