Winter of 13-14 Packs a Financial Punch

This year's brutal winter has had an impact on the City's budget as well. The combination of extremely cold weather and a record setting 67 inches of snow have had the public works department putting in double the overtime to repair water breaks and clear our streets.

Here is the comparison of overtime from this year to last year:

As you can see from these figures, the winter this year is equivalent to 2 of last year's winter.

Fortunately, due to the previous mild winter, the City had been able to stockpile salt, but finally exhausted the previous years accumulated salt in the first week of February of this year. As of February 19, the City has used 500 tons of salt from this season's allotment in store in addition to the stockpile from previous years.

When all costs are calculated, last year the City spent approximately \$69,330 for the period of December through February. This year the City has spent approximately \$143,850 through February 19.

More importantly however, is the physical toll on our public works crews as a result of the combination of water breaks and snow removal. We really owe them our gratitude and a big "thank you" for their hard work and dedication in keeping our City functioning during this trying winter season.

Northlake Resident Going to the Paralympics

When Brody Roybal was 7 years old, he knew he wanted to be involved in sports. He just didn't know which one. So he tried regular T-ball, disabled baseball and disabled basketball. Then he discovered sled hockey. He has been a part of that sport ever since and his determination and dedication are showing. Brody has been chosen to be part



of the Sled Hockey team in the 2014 Paralympics which will be played in Sochi, Russia from March 7 to the 16th. The sport is called Sled Hockey in the U.S., but Sledge Hockey elsewhere in the world.

At the age of 15, Brody is the youngest person to be chosen for the team. About 100 people tried out. Sled Hockey, Brody said, gets as rough as the regular game. He

practices every morning from 6:00 to 7:00 a.m. with his coach, Jim Smith, and then he skates with the team on Tuesday, Wednesday and Sunday.

Ms. Sremaniak, the Dean at West Leyden, said the students are impressed and yet they feel this is just Brody and they are not surprised. He left for training camp in mid-February in North Carolina, returned to Northlake for a few days, then off to Colorado and then to Sochi.

Brody said he wanted to thank his mom, dad and brother, and his grandmother and grandfather for all their support and confidence in him. He also wanted to thank his coaches, Jim and J.J., Ms. Sremaniak, Kevin Nowracha, his trainer who got him here and his friend Zak Urbaniak.

We all wish Brody and his team good luck in Sochi.

Northlake Police Traffic Safety Division Winter Driving Safety Tips

The Northlake Police Department Traffic Division would like to give you some winter driving safety tips to remember as you travel in and around town.

Stay mindful of the snowplow trucks. The snowplow truck driver's field of vision is restricted. You may see them, but they may not see you.

Allow extra time for travel during the winter months.

Watch out for black ice on roads that appear clear but can be treacherous. Take it slow when approaching intersections, off ramps, bridges and shady areas. All are prone to black ice, which is often invisible.

Always keep your gas tank at least two-thirds full to help prevent the vehicle's fuel line from freezing.

Always wear a safety belt.





Just Hang Up!

The Best Way to Avoid Telephone Scams Is Also the Easiest.

Every day, seniors throughout Illinois fall prey to smooth-talking con artists who call them up and tell all kinds of convincing stories to get their money.

The Office of the Illinois Attorney General wants you to know that it's shrewd, not rude, to hang up the phone when a stranger asks you to send them money or give out your personal information.

The following are some common warning signs of telephone scams. If you spot any of these signs while on the phone, don't think twice:

Just Hang Up!

THEY CONTACT YOU. When you look up the number of a reputable business on your own and call to place an order, you have a good idea who's on the other end of the deal. But when the tables are turned and someone calls you, you have no way of knowing who the person really is, where they're calling from, or what they want from you. **Just Hang Up!**

THEY WANT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION. Any time a stranger asks you for your bank account number, Social Security number, or other sensitive information, you should be on high alert. This is a sure sign of identity theft. **Never** give personal or financial information to someone you do not know. **Just Hang Up!**



Just Hang Up!

THEY PROMISE A BIG AWARD. Scammers try to lure you in with promises of unexpected riches such as a large sum of money, a vacation, or a "get rich quick" investment scheme. Remember: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. **Just Hang Up!**

YOU MUST PAY THEM FIRST. It is illegal for someone to require an upfront payment to claim a lottery or sweepstakes prize. Scammers will often tell you that you must wire money out of state, or even out of the country, to obtain your winnings. **Never** wire money to a stranger. Wiring money is just like sending cash—scammers will get the money quickly, and you won't get it back. **Just Hang Up!**

Consider placing your phone number on the **National Do Not Call Registry**, if you haven't already done so. This will block most unwanted telemarketing calls. So, once your number is on the registry, you'll know that any telemarketer who does call you is probably up to no good. You can register your home phone or cell phone online at www.donotcall.gov or by calling 1-888-382-1222 (TTY: 1-866-290-4236) from the phone number you wish to register.



Solicitors Warning

The City of Northlake, the Northlake Police Department and the Northlake Fire Department are NOT asking for donations from residents of Northlake. If you receive a phone call, or someone solicits door to door, before you donate, call City Hall to see if anyone who requests funds is registered with the Clerk's Office.

Reminder About Tents

Tents, defined as any portable structure, including sunscreens, with or without walls, made of canvas or other like materials, need to be dismantled from the front yard between Memorial Day and Labor Day. These structures need to be dismantled from areas other than the front yard between November 1 and April 1. This ordinance, O-16-2002, includes poles, stakes, wires and ropes.

Wipers and Lights

Motorists are reminded that Illinois Vehicle Code 12-201(b) requires the use of headlights, not only from sunset to sunrise, but also any time snow, rain, ice, for or other weather conditions require the use of windshield wipers. Headlights must also be used any time a person or vehicle on the highway is not clearly visible at a distance of 1,000 feet.

Placing Trash at Curb

Residents are reminded that trash may not be placed on the parkway before 5 p.m. the evening before the scheduled pick-up, which is Friday morning, unless there is a holiday during the week, when pick up will be on Saturday. Containers must be removed from the parkway by 5:00 p.m.

Inoperable Vehicles Prohibited

Northlake Municipal Code prohibits storing or parking junk cars or inoperable vehicles in residential districts. This regulation applies to any unlicensed vehicles or those with flat tires, broken windshields or other conditions that make them inoperable.




