




Bids to be Opened for Infrastructure Work

On May 5, the City Council will be opening bids for infrastructure repair and replacement projects at various locations throughout the City.

These projects are:

- 1) Replacement of water main on the 300 block of Major Drive from Roberta to Geneva. This work will entail the installation of a new 8 inch ductile iron water main to replace the 4 inch cast iron main, installation of new fire hydrants, new b-boxes, point repairs to both storm and sanitary sewers and repaving the entire street.
- 2) Installation of new water mains under Addison Creek on Victoria Drive. The new main will be directionally bored under the creek and connected to existing mains on


either side of the creek.

- 3) Palmer Avenue Bridge to be resurfaced. This work will involve removal of the old surface and re-paving the roadway surface over the bridge. This repair will make the bridge serviceable until funds are secured for replacement of the bridge in the future.

- 4) Sanitary Sewer Lining will also take place in the area near 46th Avenue and Soffel.

Later this year, bids will be opened for resurfacing of Golfview Drive. Work is also underway on the replacement of the 50 year old traffic signals at the corner of Wolf and Winters.

On an academic note, I had the honor of speaking to the urban studies class taught by Cook County Clerk David Orr at the University of Chicago on April 10. It was great to interact with students and give them some insight on the working of local government.

Recognizing Seniors

May is Older Americans Month, an annual event dating back to 1963, when President John F. Kennedy designated May as Senior Citizens Month. It was later renamed Older Americans Month, honoring older Americans and celebrating their contributions to our communities and our nation.

In honor of Older Americans Month, I believe it's important to take a moment and focus on the crimes that have been and continue to be committed throughout Illinois, including our region, against senior citizens. Far too often, scam artists perceive senior citizens as vulnerable and sometimes well-off due to their ability to access retirement accounts and pensions. As a result, seniors are a frequent target of a wide range of consumer fraud scams.

Sadly, financial exploitation is not the only threat to seniors' safety. Physical and sexual abuse of elderly citizens is far too prevalent. This often unreported crime is devastating to both victims and family members. In response to this serious problem, the Attorney General's office is working with advocates, other government agencies and law enforcement officials to root out abuse.

Together, we can help to put an end to those who take advantage and hurt senior citizens, but only if we stand up when we suspect something is wrong.



Proclamation


WHEREAS, Autism is a complex neurological disease and developmental disability that robs children of social skills, the ability to talk, interact and do the normal things that are often taken for granted, transcending all social, cultural and geographic boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the CDC recently announced another alarming increase in Autism affecting "one in every sixty-eight children" born today and affects boys nearly five times the level of girls (1 in 42 boys & 1 in 189 girls). It has been diagnosed at a higher rate than Pediatric Aids, Juvenile Diabetes, Downs Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy and all Pediatric Cancers combined and is considered to be our country's number one medical condition afflicting children today and is considered among the fastest growing global public health crisis's; and (30% increase since 2008, 78% increase from 2002, recent increase is noted by 2010 numbers). *Source Center for Disease Controls (CDC)

WHEREAS, Autism is treatable through early diagnosis, early intervention including critical intensive medically necessary therapies such as Speech therapy, Occupational therapy, Physical therapy, ABA therapy, RDI floor time, and other behavior therapies, combined with medical interventions have been proven to be extremely effective often unlocking the world of Autism to enable these beautiful children the ability to communicate and interact with the ultimate goal of a independent and fulfilling productive life; and

WHEREAS, the month of April is World Autism Month and the global autism community will celebrate the seventh annual United Nations-sanctioned World Autism Awareness Campaign a to bring awareness. World Autism Awareness Day (WAAD), celebrated on April 2 annually, was adopted by the United Nations in 2007 to shine a bright light on autism as a growing global health crisis. WAAD activities increase and develop world knowledge of the autism crisis and impart information regarding the importance of early diagnosis and early intervention. Additionally, WAAD celebrates the unique talents and skills of persons with autism and is a day when individuals with autism are warmly welcomed and embraced in community events around the globe. Autism is one of only three health issues to be recognized by the United Nations with its own day.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jeffrey T. Sherwin, Mayor of the City of Northlake, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2014 as Autism Awareness Month in the City of Northlake to promote awareness and early detection of Autism and ask residents to recognize April as "World Autism Awareness Month."

Wipers and Lights


Motorists are reminded that Illinois Vehicle Code 12-201(b) requires the use of headlights, not only from sunset to sunrise, but also any time snow, rain, ice, for or other weather conditions require the use of windshield wipers. Headlights must also be used any time a person or vehicle on the highway is not clearly visible at a distance of 1,000 feet.

Placing Trash at Curb

Residents are reminded that trash may not be placed on the parkway before 5 p.m. the evening before the scheduled pick-up, which is Friday morning, unless there is a holiday during the week, when pick up will be on Saturday. Containers must be removed from the parkway by 5:00 p.m.

Inoperable Vehicles Prohibited

Northlake Municipal Code prohibits storing or parking junk cars or inoperable vehicles in residential districts. This regulation applies to any unlicensed vehicles or those with flat tires, broken windshields or other conditions that make them inoperable.

Middle East Conflicts Wall Memorial

On June 19, 2004, a memorial wall was dedicated commemorating the servicemen and women who lost their lives in conflicts since 1979. It is called the Middle East Conflicts Wall Memorial. The project was built with donated material and labor and is the first one built while the conflict is still in operation. The wall is located in Marseilles, Illinois.



On the third Sunday in June, thousands of motorcyclists ride to the Wall to raise money to engrave the names of the fallen. There are tens of thousands of participants each year. From the Building Department and Code Enforcement Department

The warm days of summer are upon us. This is the time that many property owners are enjoying the outdoors, doing home improvements and gardening. Here are some things to keep in mind this summer.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

- Grass should be kept at no more than 8 inches in height. Noxious weeds are prohibited.
- Bushes, trees, and other plantings must be trimmed so that they are not a hazard. In particular, they must not impede pedestrian and automobile traffic.
- When cleaning your yard, don't forget the alley, if you have one
- Keep garbage can lids on tight
- Screens must be in place on all windows and remain in good repair
- Remove all standing water
- Clean up after your pets

CODE ENFORCEMENT COMPLAINTS

In the spring and summer, the code enforcement officers handle hundreds of complaints.

Feeding Wild Animals

Feeding birds is a favorite pastime for many, but birdseed also lures nuisance animals like pigeons, squirrels, raccoons, skunks, and even rats. By increasing the food supply, feeding birds can encourage the rapid growth of animal populations. Department of Public Health and Safety officials are often then required to trap the intruders. Diseases are also spread from animal to animal through infected feeders and bird baths.

Be cautious in your feeding of birds. Place food in a bird feeder. Regularly rake under the feeder to remove food from the ground. If the notice nuisance animals, remove the food source at once. Disinfect feeders with a small amount of bleach every two weeks. Change the water in bird baths weekly (this will also help reduce the risk of West Nile Virus).

Also, the City Council recently passed an ordinance prohibiting the feeding of geese, ducks and other waterfowl, especially in Centerpoint Preserve. Feeding of waterfowl is harmful to the birds, and also encourages them to linger at Centerpoint where they leave droppings on the bike path and playing fields. Signs have been posted, and the fine is \$25.00 per violation. If you don't want your children playing in good waste, please do not encourage the geese to hang around by feeding them.

Building Permits

Please remember that Building Permits are required before undertaking most construction projects in your home. Building Permits ensure that the construction conforms to the Zoning Ordinance and Building Codes. To obtain a building permit or request information, contact the Building Department at (708) 343-8700.

Fence Permits

A permit for a fence is required before you install the fence. Fences are not allowed in the front yard of a residential property. To obtain a fence permit, residents must complete a simple application form, show a copy of their plat of survey, and indicate the location, size, height, and type of fence to be installed. If a contractor is installing the fence, the contractor must be licensed, bonded, and insured and present a copy of the contract.

Excavation Work

For your protection, call the Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators (J.U.L.I.E.) at the number below before you dig for any home improvement project, including additions, sheds, decks, pools, or tree planting. J.U.L.I.E. is a message handling service which coordinates the locating of utilities to protect those digging and the underground facilities from damage.

J.U.L.I.E.'s number is toll free and they operate 24 hours a day, 365 days per year. When you or your excavator call, J.U.L.I.E.'s operator will request your name, phone number, and address, as well as the excavation site address, the type and extent of work, and start date. J.U.L.I.E. 1-800-892-0123 Illinois State Law requires two-working days notice.

Be A Good Neighbor

The following are matters of being good neighbors:

- The parking of vehicles in the grass is prohibited
- Loud music from cars and residences is not only disturbing to your neighbors, it can result in a ticket and fine
- Garbage is not allowed to be placed out for collection before 5:00 pm. on Thursday
- Fireworks are illegal, and especially disturbing to your neighbors late at night.
- The Illinois Vehicle Code requires that all motorized vehicles using the streets must be licensed. This means that all motorized scooters, go-carts, dirt bikes, etc. are prohibited from the streets unless they are licensed by the state. These devices are also prohibited from our sidewalks and the bike path as well. Parents, please remember that if you purchase these items for your children, they are only allowed on private property, and that operation on the public right of way is at your own risk and could result in a citation.

A large number of Code Enforcement calls can be eliminated if everyone remembers to be a good neighbor, especially during the summer when everyone is outside and the windows are open. Let's try to remember this so that everyone can have an enjoyable summer.

Microbeads Pose Hazard to our Water Supply

Small pinhead sized plaster beads that act as scrubbers in toothpaste, facial scrubs and shaving creams are finding their way into fresh water sources. Although these items are approved for use in those products, they are not biodegradable and end up being eaten by small fish as they resemble fish eggs. The smaller fish are then eaten by larger fish and this plastic finds its way into their flesh and eventually into food products.

Since these beads are not biodegradable, the ones that are not eaten collect on the bottom of water ways and attract toxic materials such as motor oil, fertilizers and insecticides.

Currently, New York and California are considering banning microbeads. Microbeads have been found in the Great Lakes, including Lake Michigan, which is the source of the City's drinking water. Waste and water treatment plants are not able to filter out microbeads. A single tube of facial scrub can contain over 305,000 microbeads. While these products may be gentle for your face, they are not good for the water supply.

Manufacturers have taken note of this environmental hazard. Unilever will phase out microbeads by 2015, while Johnson and Johnson will stop developing new products which contain this hazard. Walgreens is considering removing microbeads from its house brand items.

There is currently legislation pending in Springfield to ban microbeads by 2017. While this is commendable, action should also be taken on the federal level. Please contact your state and federal representatives and urge them to take action.

CEDA Home Weatherization Program

The Illinois Home Weatherization Program, administered by CEDA, has helped thousands of Cook County income-eligible residents save energy and money. Most homes waste energy, however, different types of homes have different energy issues. They all lose heat.

Home weatherization is always performed free of charge for approved homeowners. Approved rental properties require a 50% contribution for any work related to the heating system.


